Today is the Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today's Gospel is the parable about a man going on a journey. He entrusts his possessions to his servants. To one, he gives five talents, another two, and a third one. A talent had a value of about \$6,000 dollars in today's value. The one with five traded and made five more. The one with two, made another two. The one with one, buried his and made nothing.

Upon the man's return, he wanted to settle accounts. To the one who made five more, he gave greater responsibilities. The one who made two more, received greater responsibilities as well. The one who made nothing, was called wicked and a lazy servant. The man took the one talent and gave it to the servant with ten. For to everyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away. Throw this useless servant into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.

God has given us many things. Actually, He has given us all that we have. He expects us to use it to build up the Kingdom, to bear fruit. It is not for our own personal use only. By sharing what God has given us with others, God in return increases what we have. We are to share our time, talents and possessions. To do any other is to lead to greed and self destruction. There is never enough if we look out only for oneself. When we help others, there is always enough. *There is enough time, talents, and possessions to meet the need. There may be a little more.*

We are the happiest when we share. That's why people have parties, to share the joy. God will not be out done in generosity. Trust Him, and we will be given greater responsibilities, and share in the master's joy, for all eternity.

Area Happenings

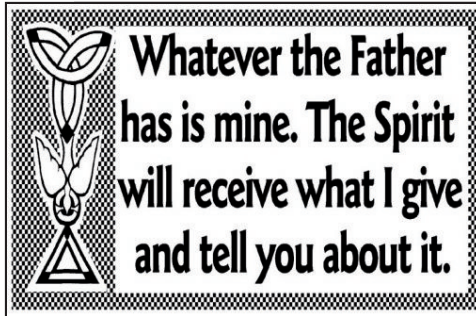
