

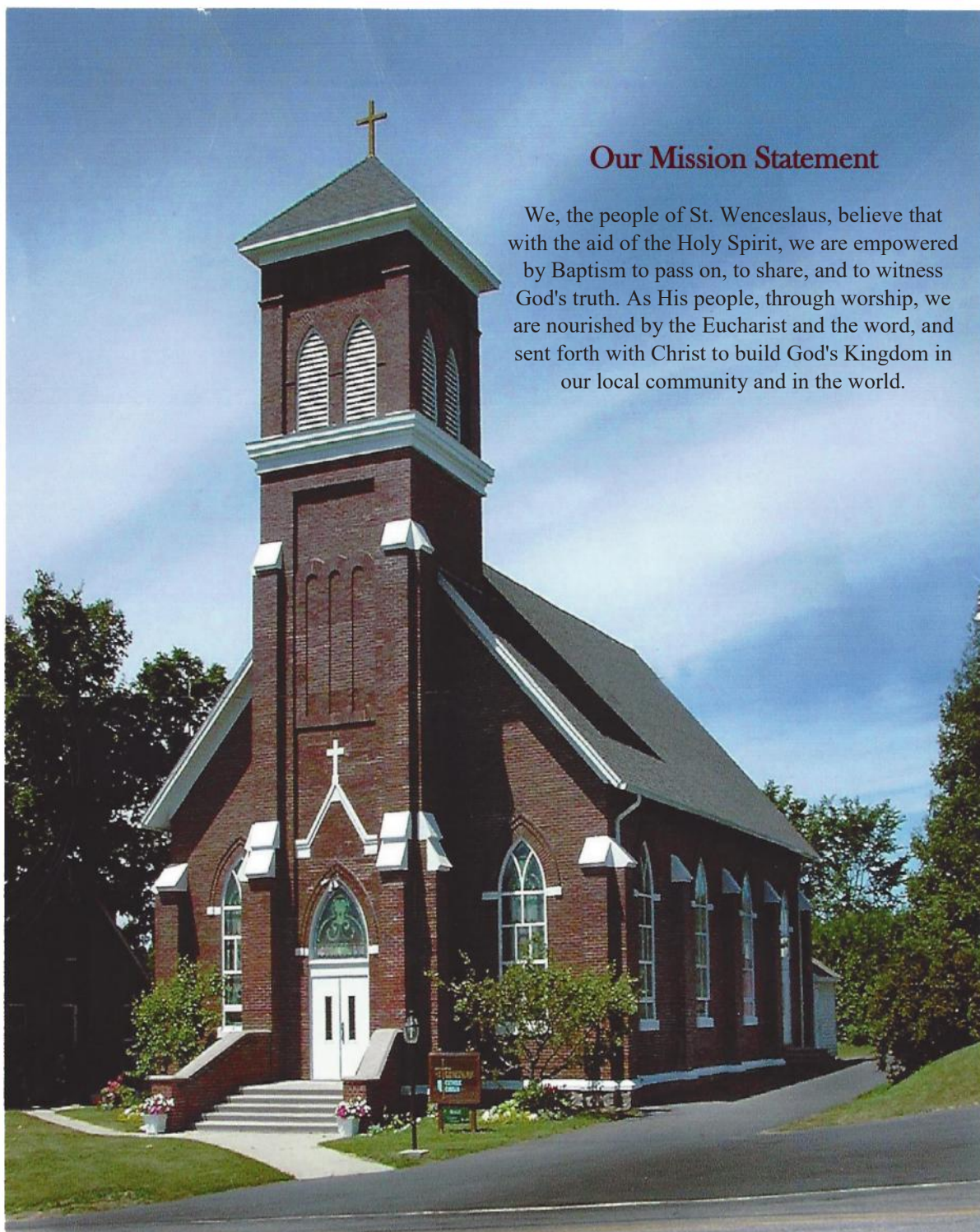

Greetings to All,

Today is the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Jesus, saddened by the death of His cousin, John the Baptist, withdrew to a deserted place wishing to be alone. It is a natural, human instinct to mourn a loved one by one's self for a while. He needed His space.

When He landed on shore, a crowd was waiting for Him. He had pity on them. He set aside His needs and reached out to them, curing their sick, spending time with them.

After a long day, the disciples asked Jesus to send the crowd away. Jesus' response was, "Feed them yourself." This had to be shocking to them for they had only five loaves of bread and two fish. Jesus blessed the bread and the fish and gave them back to the disciples to give to the people, numbering about five thousand plus. It would be like feeding people at a full football stadium with five hotdogs and two sodas. Feeding the people would be an impossible task.

The disciples did the impossible with Jesus' help. We are asked to do the same. Go to Jesus, explain your situation, and listen to His advice. Often times, we present a problem to Jesus, but also give Him the solution, then we wonder why things don't change or get better. Our solution gets in the way of hearing Jesus' voice. We have to learn to surrender to His will, to be His hands, His feet, His voice, and His servants. Are we up to the task?

Saint of the Week-St. John Vianney-Feast Day August 4

Born near Lyon, France, this farmer's son studied for the priesthood for many years, and eventually was ordained more for his devoutness and goodwill than for other qualities. But he became a model parish priest in Arsen-Dombes, where he served for 40 years. He was devoted to his parishioners, and became famous for rigorous preaching and insights in the confessional. The Cure of Ars, as he was known, spent up to 18 hours a day hearing the confessions of pilgrims who sought him out. He is the patron of parish priests.

The apostles were just being practical when they asked Jesus to "dismiss the crowds to go buy food." Jesus knew there is always enough when we place our trust in the Father, even with just 5 loaves and two fishes. Trust is the bridge to miracles.

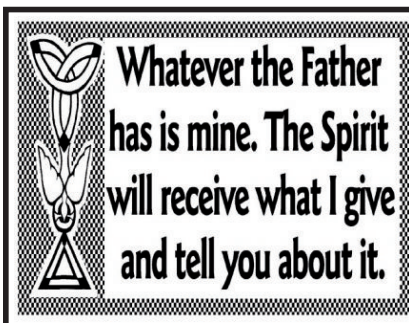
