

#### Good Day to All!

Today is the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today's Gospel tells of the incident Jesus has with a Canaanite woman. She is not Jewish. She is a Gentile and a woman. She had two strikes against her. A good Jewish male did not speak to either. The odds were stacked against both of them.

The woman takes the initiative to approach Jesus and ask Him to have pity on her, calling Him Lord and Son of David. Asking Him for help. Her daughter is tormented by a demon. Jesus makes a bold statement. I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." The woman persists, pleading that, "Even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of the Master."

The woman continued asking Jesus. Her unwavering faith moves Him to do her will. She not only had faith that Jesus could heal her daughter, she continued to ask for His help against the objections of the disciples. Jesus worked many signs for the people who were considered outsiders by the Jews. He worked with them to show His love for them, His faith in them and their faith in Him.

In our life, the media, the world, the crowd, tells us not to bother asking for help from Jesus. Very seldom are we asked to pray, to acknowledge His presence and His ability to help. They are very subtle in sending us away from Jesus. There is a silent denial. We have to be determined in our prayer, to ask over and over again, giving homage to Jesus, saying, "Lord, help Me."

We can learn much from the Canaanite woman. 1. Believe in Jesus. 2. Give Him Homage. 3. Pray to Him, ask Him for help. 4. Don't be swayed by the crowd, sometimes you may find yourself standing apart from the others. Be brave!

#### **Area Happenings**


