Greetings to All!

Today is the Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today Jesus presents the parable of a man having two sons. He asks them to go work in his vineyard. One says I will not, and the other says he will. The one who said he would go, did not go. The one who said he would not, later went into the vineyard. Jesus asks the chief priests and elders of the people, "Who did the will of the father?" They responded, the first, the one who first said no.

Jesus said, "tax collectors and prostitutes are entering into the kingdom of God before you." The tax collectors and prostitutes heard and changed their ways, "You heard and did not repent or change your ways."

We as Christians, as Catholics, say we believe in Jesus Christ and His teachings; Love God and love your neighbor. We should be obedient to His teachings and the teachings of the Church. 
