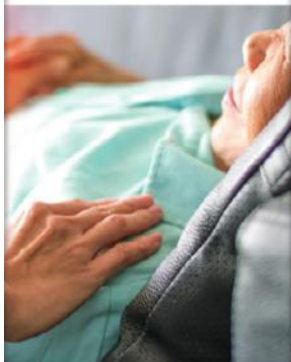
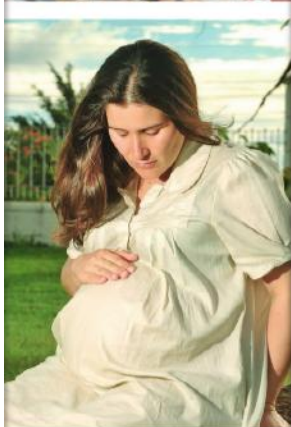


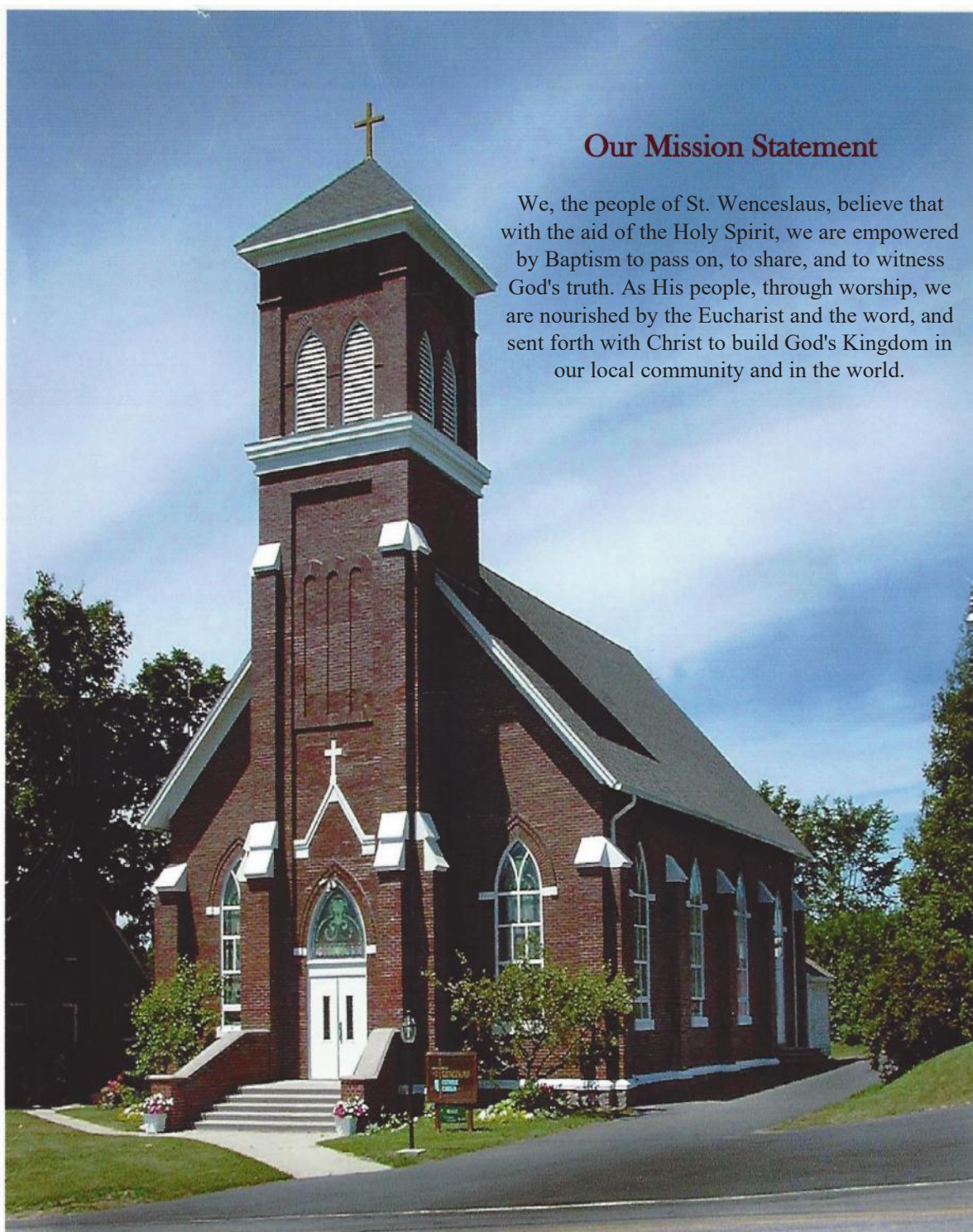

Greetings to All!

Today is the Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable about a landowner, who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a tower. He then leased it to tenants and went on a journey. When harvest came, he sent his servants out to obtain his produce.

The tenants beat one, killed one, and stoned the other. The landowner sent more servants to collect his rent. They were treated the same. Finally, he sent his son. The tenants killed him as well.

Jesus then asked the leaders what the landowner should do. They replied, "give those wretched men a wretched death and give the vineyard to others."

We are the tenants of God's kingdom. The fruits of our work in our lives will show us to be shares in God's kingdom, or not. We exclude ourselves from the kingdom by hanging onto old guilt, being cynical and self-centered, believing that we are good enough, or living on autopilot rather than with thanksgiving and celebration.

Are we producing good fruit for the Kingdom? The tenants in the parable wanted to keep it all for themselves. Are we sharing our talents, our time, our gifts, our treasures, for our kingdom, or God's Kingdom? Let's give to God what He has shared with us.

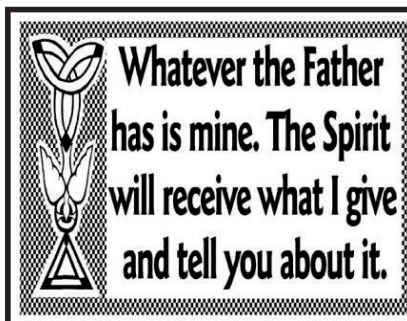
