

Greetings to All!

Today is the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the Gospel reading today, a Scholar of the law ask Jesus, which commandment is the greatest? He asked for one. Jesus gave him two. You shall love God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. The second is to love your neighbor as yourself.

By fulfilling these two commandments we are actually fulfilling the ten commandments. Loving God is in the first three, loving neighbor is in the last seven. One of the key words is love. When Jesus speaks of love, He is not speaking of some warm fuzzy. He is speaking of putting God first, others second, and self third.

Jesus tells us how to love God. We must desire what God desires, that is the heart. We must value and understand all things the way God does, that is the mind. And we must actively live in accordance with those desires and that understanding, choosing what God would choose in our place, this is the soul.

Then, we must love our neighbors as we love ourselves, treating them as we would want them to treat us, regardless of how we feel.

In order to desire what God desires, to understand like God does, to choose like God does, we must have an active prayer life. We get to think like God, desire like God, choose like God, through prayer. Only through prayer will we put God first, others second, and self third. Then we will be fulfilling Gods two commandments. Pray! Pray that we may each do God's will.


