

Good Day to All!

Today is the Fourth Sunday of Advent. Christmas is just 5 days away. The Gospel today tells of Mary's call by the angel Gabriel to give birth to Jesus, the son of God, and her response. This was a confusing request to Mary for she was about 14 – 15 years old, in the eighth or ninth grade, by today's standards. She had her whole life ahead of her. She must have had dreams and hopes as we all do. This request was asking her to put her dreams on hold and take on new responsibilities.

There was a risk with this request. She was not married. How would she tell her parents? What would they say? What would her friends say? What would Joseph say, would he still want her? By law she could be put to death by stoning. This was not an easy decision for any one to make. But Mary was full of grace and trusted in God. He would not ask her to do any thing with out Him being by her side. This was true blind trust in God. Her response of "do to me according to your will", would change the world for ever.

God asks us ever day to do something for Him. He asks us to love God and to love our neighbor. Seems simple enough. We may not think what He asks us is very important. But what He asks will change someone's life for ever. We have only to review the ten commandments to see if we are doing what he asks us to do. Putting God first, respecting His name, keeping Holy the Lord's day, honoring our parents, helping to preserve life, these are the first of the ten commandments. These are not options or suggestions. We can go through all ten that God asks us and find ourselves in challenging situations. Our response does make a difference. We too are given the grace to answer yes. What will it be?


