

May the peace of Christ be with you all!

Today is the Third Sunday in Ordinary time. John the Baptist has been arrested. Jesus is beginning His ministry. As He was walking by the Sea of Galilee, He saw Simon and his Brother casting their nets into the sea, they were fishermen. Jesus said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." Then they abandoned their nets and followed Him. He walked a little farther and saw James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They were in a boat mending their nets. Then He called them, so they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed Him.

This seems rather sudden, but these men, who were disciples of John the Baptist, had met Jesus before. In last week's Gospel, Peter and Andrew, met Jesus and spent time with Him. He called them by name; they were not strangers. When Jesus saw them, He invited them to "Come after Me and I will make you fishers of men." The disciples left everything and followed Jesus.

This is the same message Jesus extends to us, "Come after Me." He calls us by name, He wants us to enter into a personal relationship with God. He wants to give us a more meaningful and purposeful life and ultimately, happiness.

The problem is that we are not always listening. We fill our lives with so much noise, that God's call gets lost, we don't hear it, and so we can't respond to it. If we really want to let God's call in our hearts resound. We must learn the value of silence. We must give silence a chance. You may be amazed at what God is asking you to do. Try giving God 5-10 minutes of you undivided attention each day.


