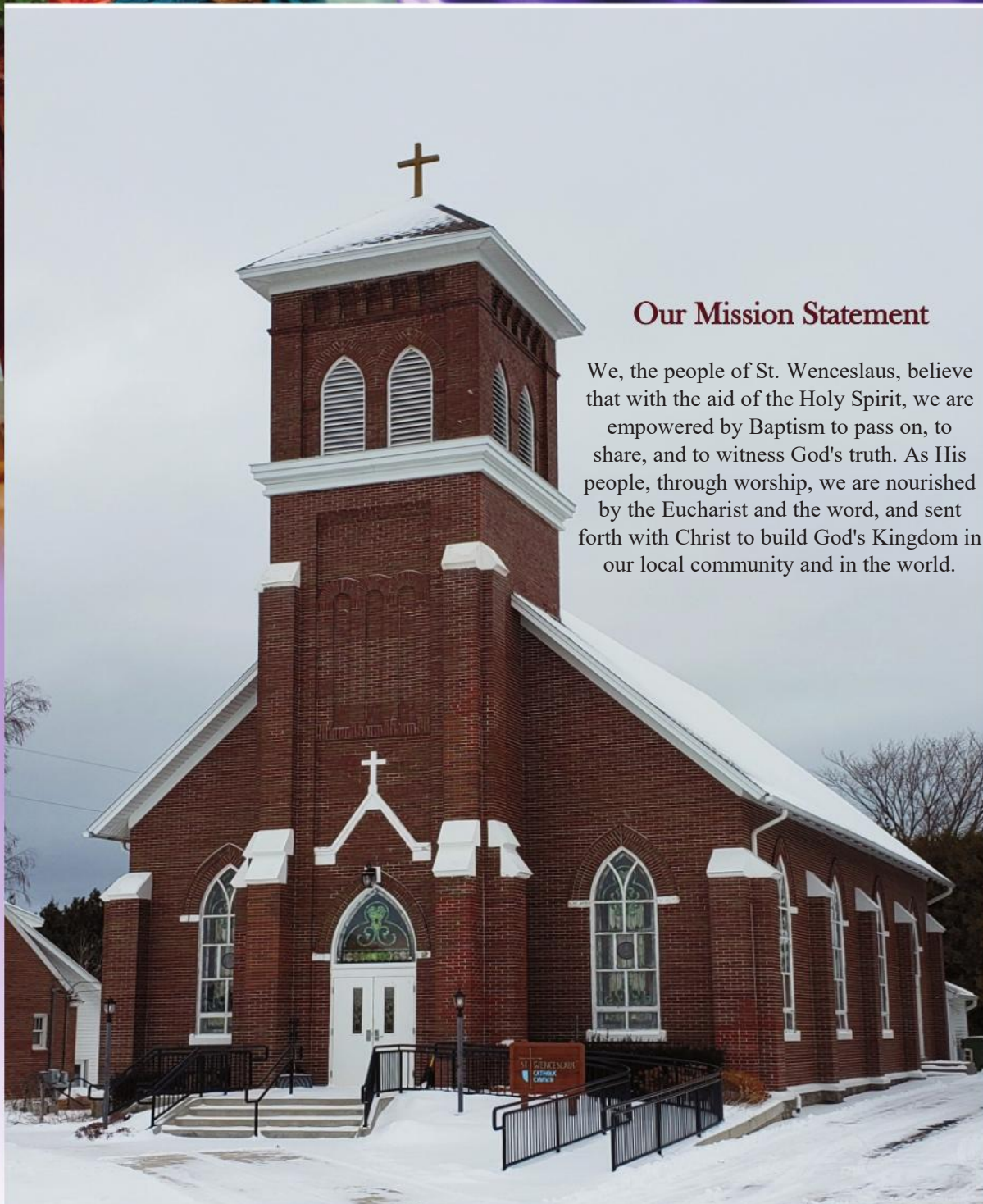
Our Mission Statement

May the peace of Christ be with you always!

Today is the First Sunday of Lent. In today's Gospel, Jesus is led into the desert and tempted by the devil for forty days. He was among wild beasts and the angels ministered to Him.

After John was arrested Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the Gospel of God. This is the time of fulfillment. "The Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the Gospel."

Jesus, being human, was tempted by the devil. But He was not alone in the desert; the angels ministered to Him. God never abandoned Him, nor does He ever abandon us. He is always there to help us. For now is the time of fulfillment. What had been promised in the old testament has been fulfilled through the coming of Jesus: God coming to earth; God becoming one of us; God reaching out to us; God speaking to us in our language; God telling us that the Kingdom of God is at hand; God telling us to repent and believe in the Gospel; to change our ways and believe in Jesus; to turn away from our self centered and selfish habits.

Jesus eagerly invites us to repent, and He also gives us the perfect way to do so: the sacrament of confession. Jesus instituted confession because He knew we would need it. The same devil that tempted Jesus in the desert is still in business, tempting us in the desert of our consumerist and relativistic culture. Repentance and confession gives God a chance to pour his unconditional mercy into our thirsty souls. During this Lenten season, let's take Jesus up on His offer, repent and believe in the Gospel.

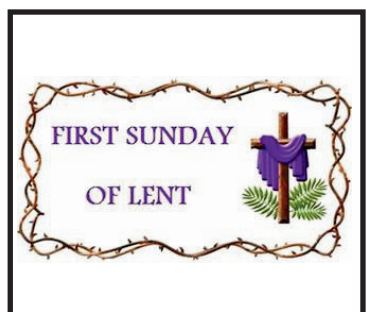

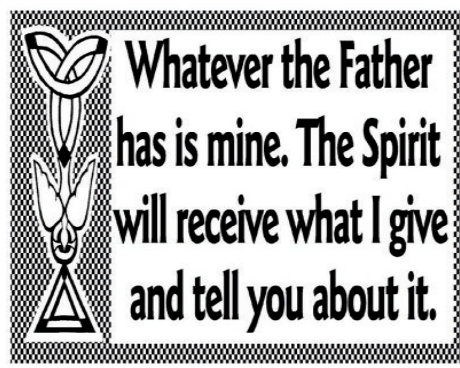
