

Today is the Third Sunday of Lent. In today's Gospel, John 2:13-25, Jesus cleanses the Temple of the money makers. Jesus went to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover. Upon entering the Temple, He saw those who sold oxen, sheep and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip of cords and drove them out, overturning the tables and spilling coins, telling them to stop making my Father's house a marketplace.

The practice of sacrificing unblemished animals was part of the Passover rite. The selling of these animals was a service to the pilgrims who traveled a distance to get to Jerusalem. The problem was they were making large amounts of money from the sales and money exchanges in the name of religion. In short they were extorting money in the name of religion. They were making money off of religious practices.

Jesus is saying this practice has to stop; His Father's House is a house of prayer and worship for all. We are not to put anything in front of our prayer and worship. God's House is where we go to celebrate on Sunday.

What are the things that we put in front of us that hinder our prayer and worship of God? As the money changers were greedy for money, we can be greedy for our time, our talents, and our material treasures. These can very easily get in the way of prayer, worship, and our relationship with God, as well as with our neighbor.

The holy season of Lent is a good time to cleanse our lives of things that prevent us from truly praying and worshiping God with all our mind, heart, and soul.






