

Today is the Fifth Sunday of Lent. In today's Gospel, John 12:20-33, we hear of some Greeks asking Phillip to meet Jesus. Phillip goes with Andrew and tells Jesus. Jesus tells them that His hour has come, that unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it cannot bear fruit. Whoever loves his life will lose it, but whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves Me must follow Me. The Father will honor whoever serves Me. Jesus is predicting His death and the necessity for Him to do so.

Jesus is troubled, and prays that the Father save Him from this hour, yet, He knew that it was for this hour that He had come. Jesus states, "Father, glorify your name". Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again". Jesus answered and said, "This voice did not come for my sake but for yours. Now is the time of judgment on this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to Myself."

Phillip and Andrew brought the Greeks to Jesus. We are to bring others to Jesus as well. Not just to point out to them that there He is, but to walk with them and share the message of Jesus. To be Christian is to be where Christ is. Christ is always pouring out His life for others on the cross, giving Himself for the good of others through self forgetful love. So should we be giving our lives for God and our neighbor. To be a true Christian involves not just wearing a crucifix or hanging one on the wall, but bearing the sign of the cross in the very center of our lives. Remember we do not walk alone, Jesus is with us and died for us.

Changes in the Holy Week services: There will be no foot washing on Holy Thursday. On Good Friday, reverence to the Cross will have to be done without kissing or touching the Cross, but by bowing to the Cross. Easter Vigil will start at 8:00 p.m. There will be no little candles and blessing of the fire will be in the Church.

St. Gertrude Church is open for prayer at 1:30 p.m. on Fridays. If you are unable to attend, you may join by praying the rosary from home at that time.


