Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today is the Fifth Sunday of Easter. In today's Gospel, John 15:1-18, Jesus tells His disciples He is the true vine and my Father is the vine grower. We are the branches. This symbolizes the kind of intimate relationship that Jesus desires to have between Himself and us. The branch cannot exist without the vine very long. Some vines may appear to flourish for a while, but eventually die.

Jesus often used nature to get a point across. We have all seen beautiful flowers in vases and know that in time they will die. We can pick cherry buds and bring them inside to flower, and they do for a while, but they never bear fruit, they never bear cherries. You may have seen farmers pruning their trees. The prunings are always disposed of because they will not bear any fruit. They prune so that there will be more fruit. They cut out the dead wood, they thin the brush out to let in more air and sunlight. This pruning makes for a stronger tree that can bear much more fruit.

So it is with us. If we as branches disconnect ourselves from the vine, Jesus Christ, we may flourish for awhile, even blossom, have some success, but we will not bear much lasting fruit. The success we may have is fleeting, and soon leaves us feeling empty. We must prune away those things in our life that hinder our relationship with Christ. There may be many things that hide the presence of God in our life, things that keep us from knowing Him better.

We become more like Christ when we stay connected to Him. We stay connected to Jesus by prayer, reading and listening to scripture, sharing our faith with others, attending Mass in person or on the internet or TV, reaching out to others, being friendly, allowing His grace to flourish within us. We all can bear good fruit and be happy about it.






