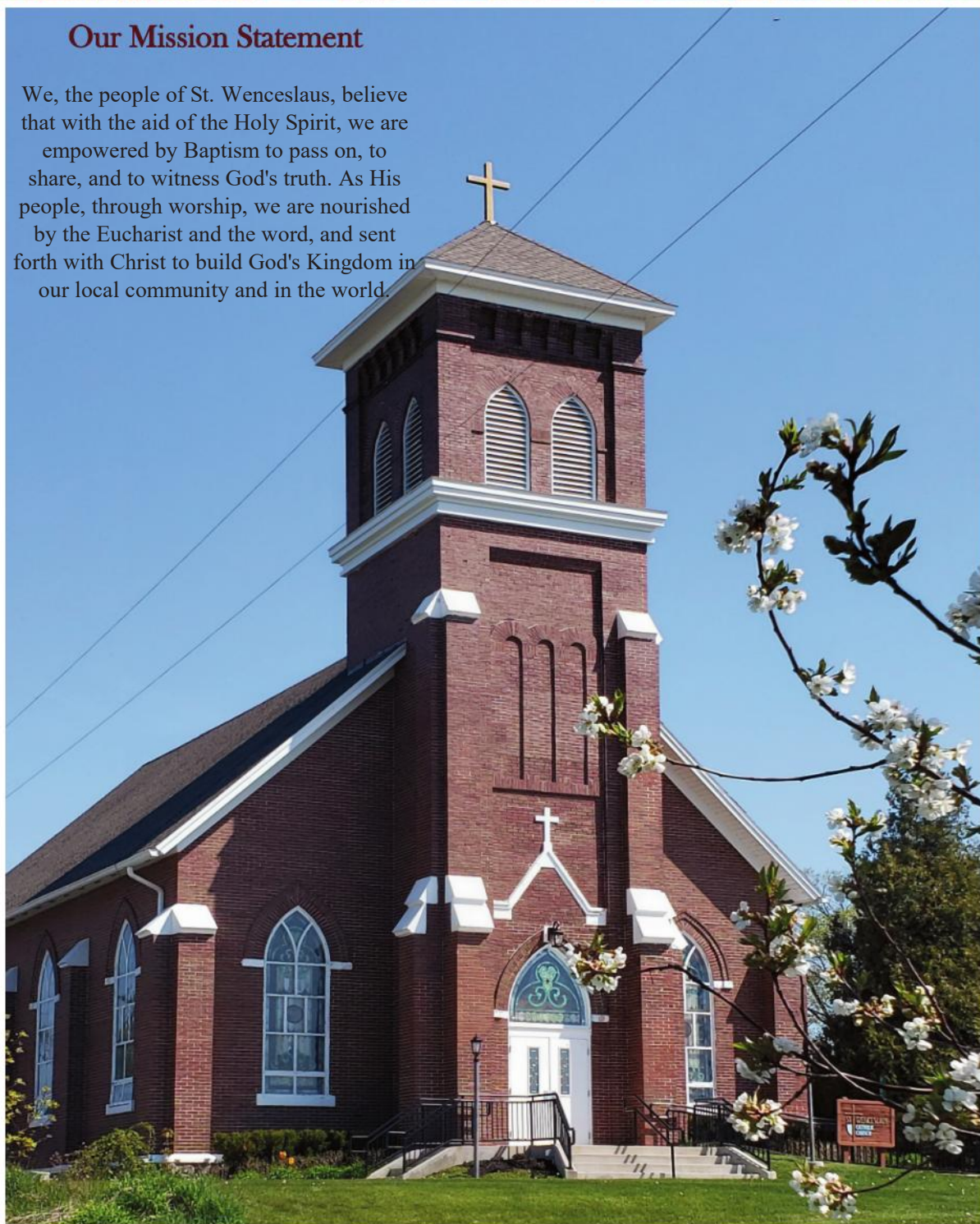




Our Mission Statement

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday. The readings for today refer to the coming of the Holy Spirit. Last week we celebrated the Ascension of Jesus into heaven. The disciples again felt abandoned. They went to an upper room in hiding for fear of the Jews. They remained there in prayer for nine days. You might say, this was the First Novena. As of yet they did not go out and preach the message of Jesus. While they were there, the Holy Spirit descended on them in the form of tongues of fire.

They were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Holy spirit enabled them to proclaim. There were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. It was into this crowd that the disciples went out with courage and confidence to preach the Gospel. All were able to understand in their own language the mighty acts of God.

The disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit after a time of prayer together. They were to act without fear and preach the message of Christ. This shows us the importance of persistent prayer together. The Holy Spirit wants to help us, wants to assist us, and wants us to make good choices. 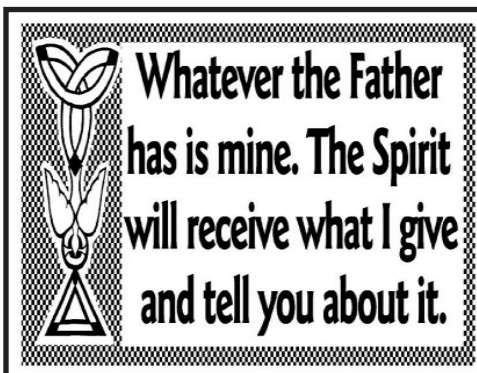
