Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the feast of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We witness the establishment of the Eucharist. In the celebration of the Jewish Passover, Jesus blessed the bread, broke it, gave it to His disciples, and said, "Take it, this is my body." Then He took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my Blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many." When Jesus speaks, it happens.

This narrative is often referred to as The Last Supper. Jesus celebrates with His disciples and His instituting of the Sacrament of the Eucharist. By Jesus' spoken word and gestures, the bread becomes His very body, and the wine becomes His very blood, the very presence of Jesus. He is just as present to us in the Eucharist as He was to the disciples 2,000 years ago.

When the priest says the words at the consecration at Mass, "This is my body", he is saying this for Jesus. He is making Jesus words audible for us to hear. Jesus is making the bread into His body. Likewise the wine becomes His blood in the same way. When we receive the Eucharist, we are receiving Jesus in a physical way. He comes to us, speaks to us, and wants to be part of our lives, our friend.

Today when we receive Him at communion, let's acknowledge the reality of His coming to us in a physical way. The man who walked the earth 2,000 years ago, has just come to us to renew His commitment to us. Let's all take some special time alone, time with Jesus, focusing on His great love for all of us, for each of us, for you and me.


Jesus chose bread and wine for the Eucharist because it is the most common of food and drink. Every country has bread and wine. They are a universal staple.


The Altar Society will meet Monday, June 7, at 7 p.m. in the Church basement.


