

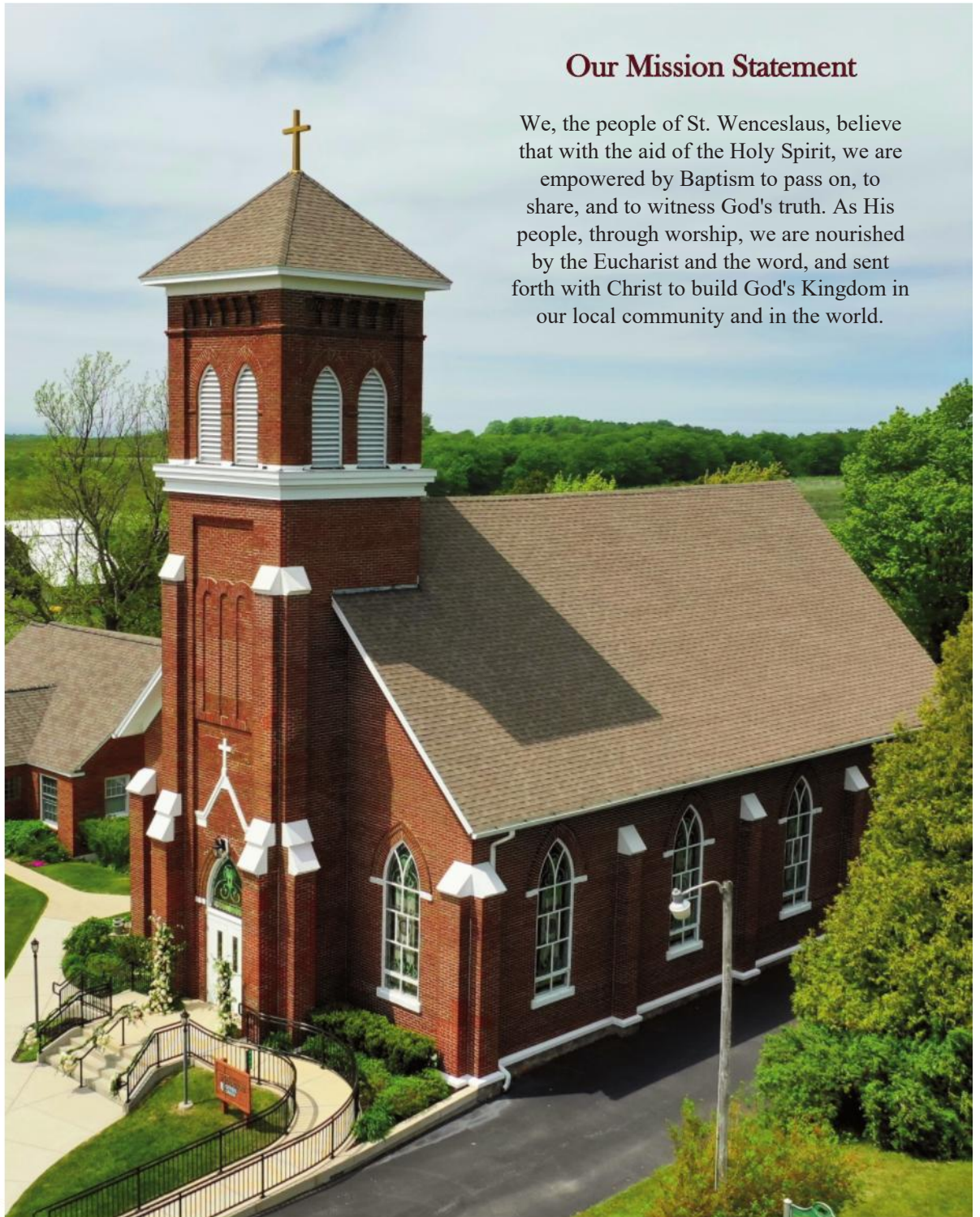

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel, John 6:1-15, we read the familiar narrative of Jesus feeding 5,000 men with 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish, an impossible task by human standards. But Jesus took the little the disciples had and was able to feed them all including woman and children to their fill. After they had eaten, they gathered the left overs and filled 12 wicker baskets of fragments.

We can look at the world and hear people say the world is going to hell in a hand basket, and it looks really grim, almost hopeless. This must have been how the disciples felt; there is no way we can feed this many people. If we look at the problems in the world and try and solve them by ourselves, it too is an impossible task. Man by himself can "never" solve these problems. Only when the disciples gave what little they had to Jesus, were they able to feed the people.

The same is true for us. Jesus can take what little we have and solve any situation if we give it to Him. There is sufficient talent, sufficient time, sufficient resources, to build the Kingdom of God, a better place where people live in harmony with each other. By sharing what we have, God can multiply what little we have to change minds, hearts, and souls. Our task is to trust in God that He knows best for us and share what we have with Him. We can change the world, but only with God's help. We see what happens when God is taken out of the picture. It is time to give God a chance! Do your part.

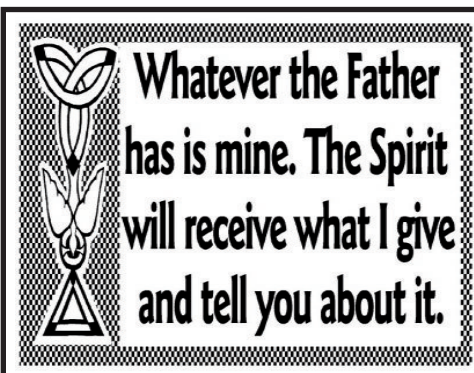
