

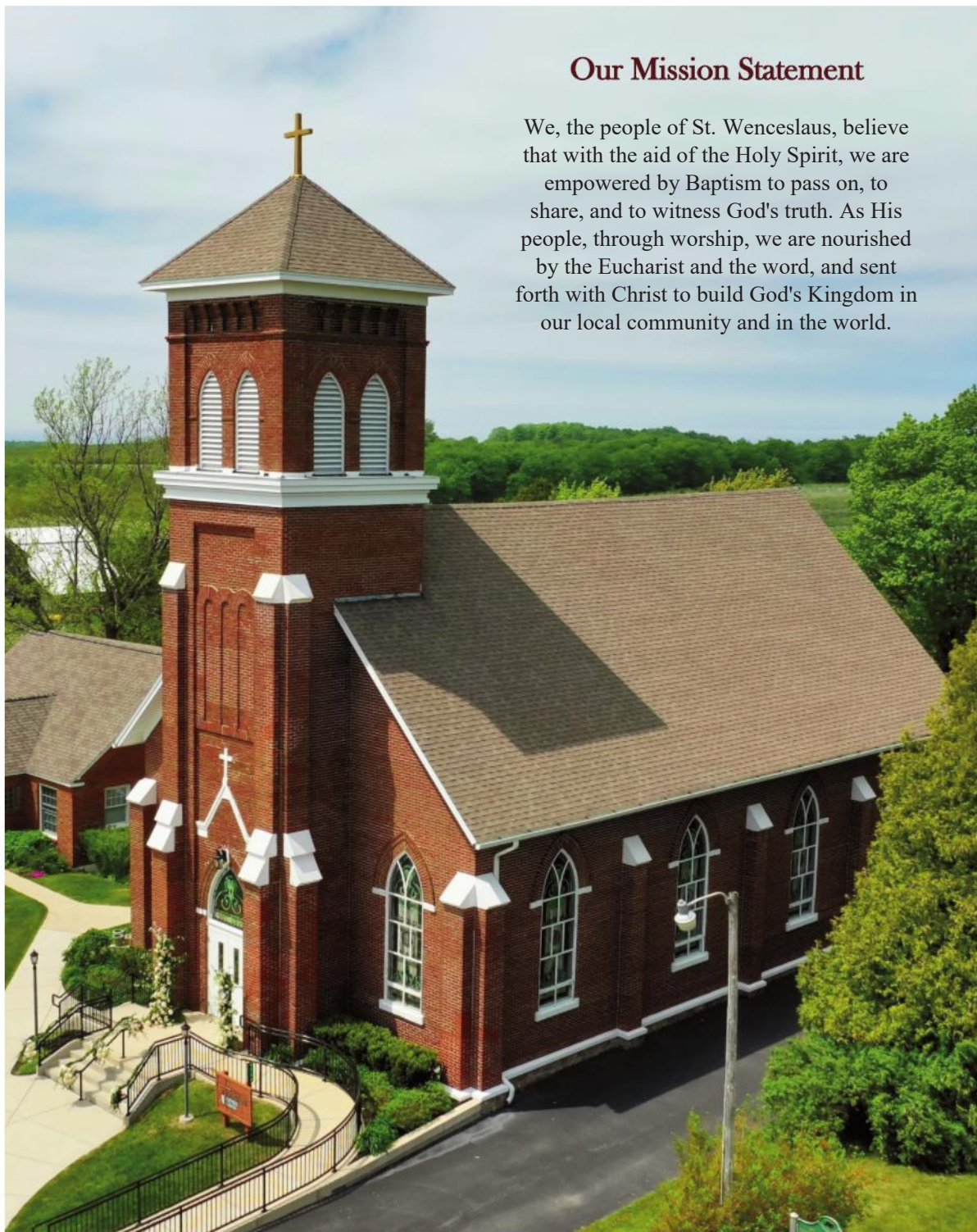

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel, John 6:41-51, we read the narrative about the Jews murmuring about Jesus, because He said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." This causes concern from the Jews, for they knew His mother and father. We often call someone who appears more religious than ourselves, a religious fanatic. This was very new to the Jews. We know the rest of the story.

Unless we accept Jesus as both human and divine, it can be difficult for us as well. Knowing that He is human and divine, we can accept Jesus's teaching that He came down from heaven, to instruct and nourish us. Our response to Him will determine our future.

We need to live our lives in accord with Jesus' message. When we hear the word, printed by man, spoken by man, as the real words of God, speaking to us, to me, it should make a difference. They are not just nice stories, but God's words spoken directly to us, to apply to our lives. The bread that He gives us, is really the body of Christ. Jesus is just as present to us in the Eucharist as He was 2,000 years ago to the apostles. He did not just walk with the apostles, He wants to walk with us, guiding us through difficult times. Let's live our lives, aware of Jesus walking with us all the time.

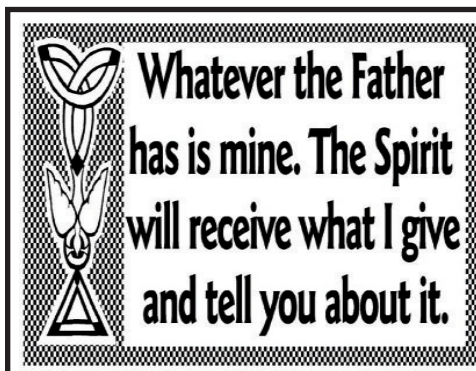
