

Dear Fellow Parishioners.

Today we celebrate the Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. This weekend's Gospel, from Mark 7:1-7, 14-15, 21-23, we read the narrative about The Pharisees concerned about the disciples eating without washing their hands. The Pharisees were concerned about the exterior of the person, that which they could see. Jesus tells them; "Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person, but the things that come out from within, the heart, are what defile."

Jesus gives us a list of things, sins, that come from the heart. Namely evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, and folly. All these things come from within, from the heart. Because of our fallen nature we can be tempted to commit one or all of these sins. All these actions can dominate a person's life if not put in check. By dominating ones life, it leaves us little time for God, family, friends, neighbor. We become slaves to the action. I have heard it said; "I can't wait till this weekend so I can party and get wasted." This is a life that leads to nowhere.

We have a free will, so we can choose to act as we will. The choice we make will draw us closer to God or hinder our relationship with Him. The better our relationship with God is, the more at peace we will be in life. If we are waiting for the weekend, let it be for the community, the Mass, the Eucharist. This is a life that leads to Eternal Life.




