

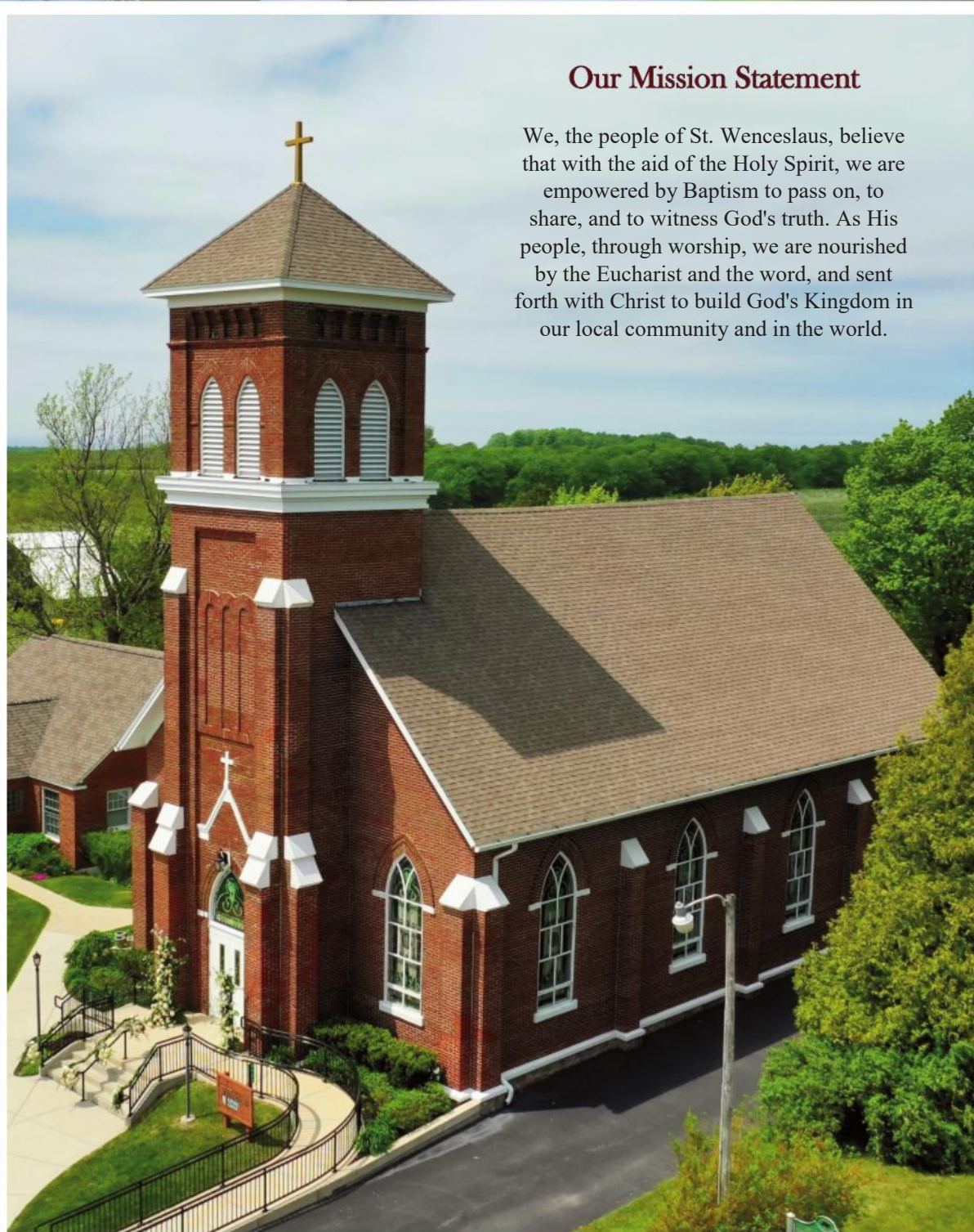

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. This week-end's Gospel, from Mark 8:27-35, we read the narrative about Jesus setting out for the village of Caesarea Philippi. On the journey, He asks His disciples, "Who do people say I am?" They respond with some say "John the Baptist, some Elijah, others one of the prophets" Jesus then asks them, "Who do you say I am?" They reply, "You are the Christ". He warns them not to tell anyone.

He then tells them about the suffering, rejection by elders, chief priests, and scribes: to be killed and rise in three days. Peter then begs Jesus not to go. Jesus responds by saying, "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings". He summoned the crowd and said to them. "Whoever wishes to come after Me must deny himself, take up His cross, and follow Me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake and that of the Gospel will save it."

Jesus asks us the same question. "Who do you say I am?" Most of us would say the words, "You are the Christ, the Son of God, the Messiah." And we would be right. But it is not enough to just say the words. It is not enough to know what other people say about Jesus: We need to encounter and respond to Him personally. We need to proclaim His lordship not only with our lips, but with our lives. We must put our words into action. We must accept our cross willingly. How we accept our cross will help us and others carry their cross. Denying ourselves little things can help us deny larger things. Accept the challenges in life as a means to grow closer to Jesus. Growing closer to Jesus, following Jesus, is how we save our lives.

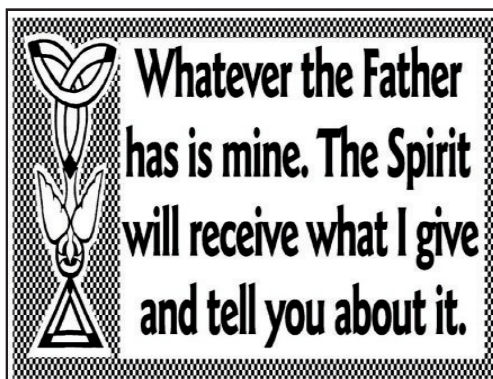
