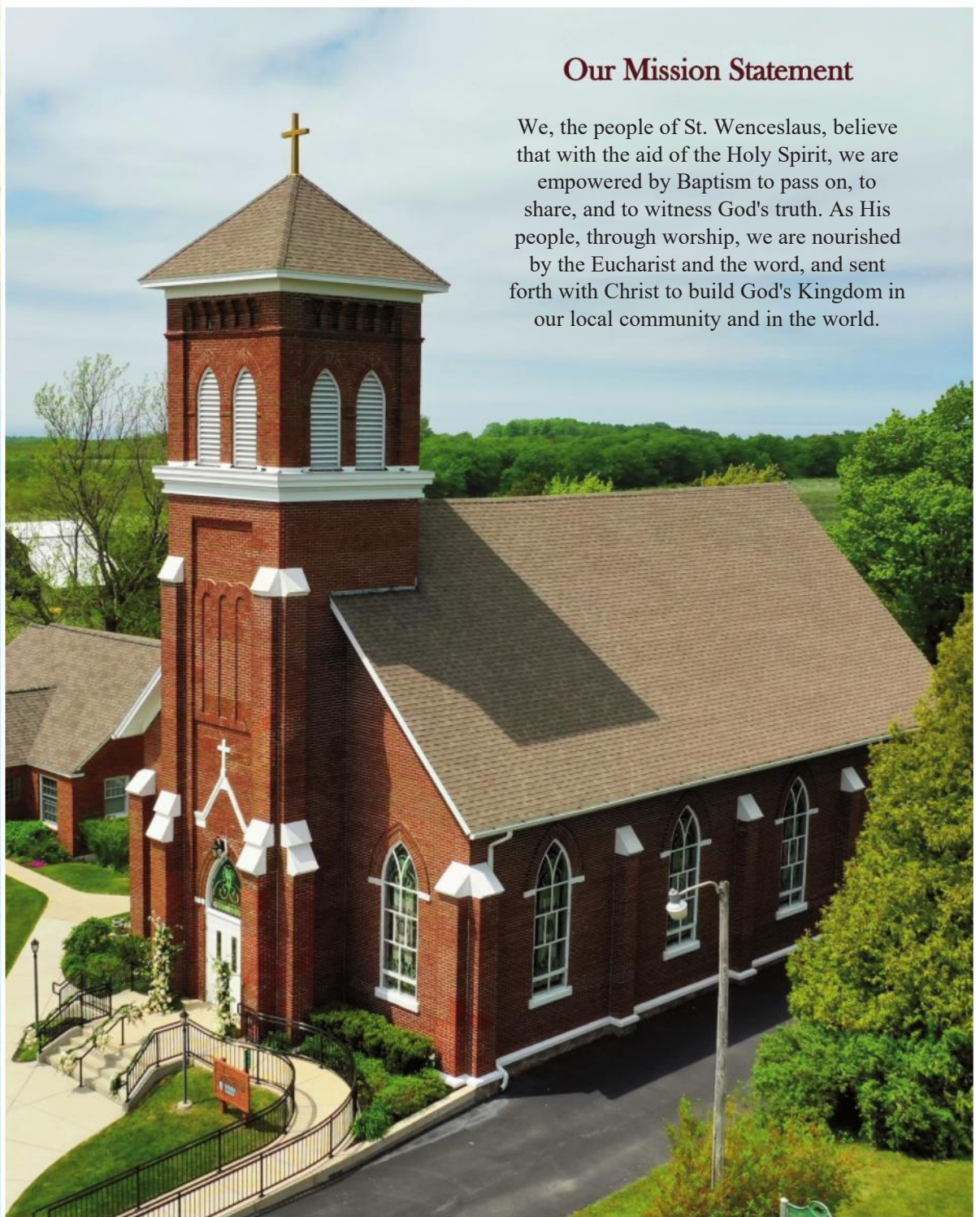


Our Mission Statement

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In this week-end's Gospel, from Mark 9:38-43, 47-48, we read the narrative about John questioning Jesus about others driving out demons in His name but were not followers. Jesus response is: "Do not prevent them. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of Me." Jesus also states that we are to cut out those things in our lives that cause us to sin. Better to enter life a cripple than to be thrown into Gehenna.

Jesus is telling us that there is a consequence to unrepented sin. We are to root out whatever causes us to sin, not to lead anyone into sin by our word or actions. Do not be the cause of anyone to sin. Rather be one who leads others to an awareness of God's presence in the world and an eternal life in heaven.

If we think about what qualities the people in heaven will have, one thing we know for sure is there will be no room for sin. We all enjoy peace, harmony with nature and fellow men, friendliness, security, recognition, and love of each other, goodness, gentleness, self control, all the gifts of the Holy Spirit. What is in heaven is what we should strive for in our lives here on earth. We need to cut out all those things that keep us from receiving these gifts, one at a time. We know what we want, now is the time to make a change and repent.

Saint of the Week: -Saint Wenceslaus- Educated by his grandmother, St. Ludmilla, Wenceslaus became duke of Bohemia (in the Czech Republic) at 15, after his father's death and an unsuccessful regency by his mother. Though young, he tried to establish the rule of law, improve education, extend Christianity and open Bohemia to the West. But he ran afoul of his nobles, who did not approve of his acknowledging the German king as their overlord, and of his younger brother's ambition. At a church dedication, Boleslas, the brother, provoked a fight with Wenceslaus in which the latter was killed. He was immediately venerated as a martyr.

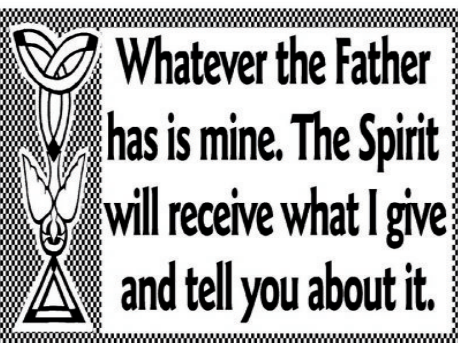
