

Today we celebrate the Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In this weekend's Gospel, from Mark 10:17-30, we read the narrative about Jesus being asked: "What must a man do to inherit Eternal Life?" "Jesus response was to keep the commandments." The man said "he had done that since his youth." Jesus replied; "Sell all you have and give it to the poor and come follow Me." The man's face fell and he went away sad for he had many possessions.


