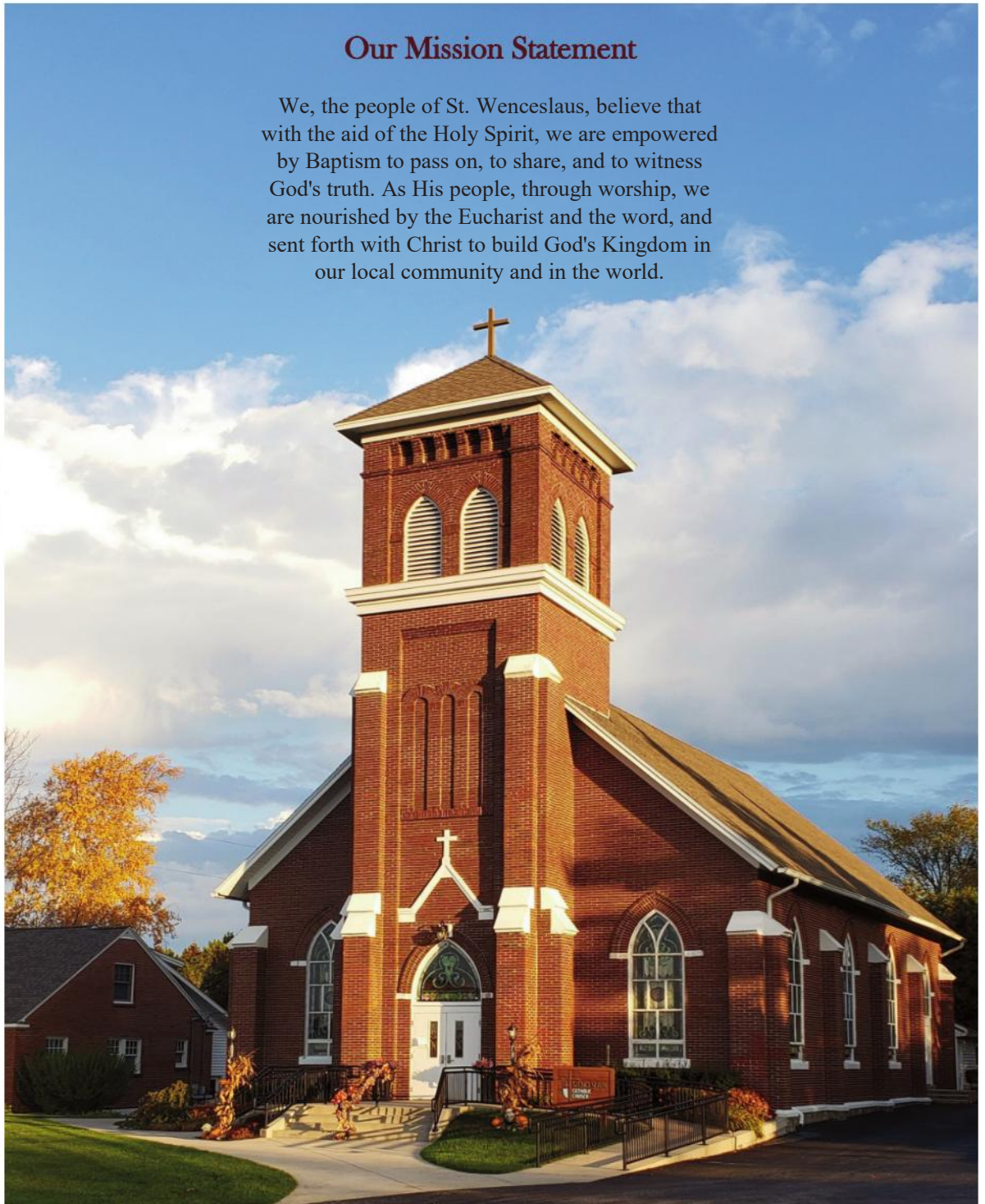

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time. In this week-end's Gospel, Mark 12:28-34, A Scribe asks Jesus "Which is the first of all the Commandments?" Jesus replies with, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength." Jesus volunteers a second Commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." The Scribe agreed with Jesus and repeated what He had said, and added, to love your neighbor is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices. Jesus replied to Him, "You are not far from the Kingdom of God".

We are to remember that the first Commandment is to love God, above all else. In listing our priorities, God must be number one. Before family, home, career, boat, job, or any other thing, God must come first. These are all good things and can aid us in getting closer to God. A relationship with God is the end goal. All other earthly things will eventually disappear from us. Only God is eternal. We only have to look around to see this taking place in the world. Where is your first toy doll or toy truck? Most of us have moved on from one of our first Christmas toys. They were temporary. They lead us to an appreciation of the giver. All things should lead us to a relationship with God. A Love of God.

The second Commandment is to love your neighbor as yourself. It is by loving our neighbor that we learn to love God. The old saying, "How can you love a God who you can not see if you can not love a neighbor who you can see." The two Commandments work together. When we carry out these two Commandments we are not far from the Kingdom of God. We know it, for we feel good about the situation.
