

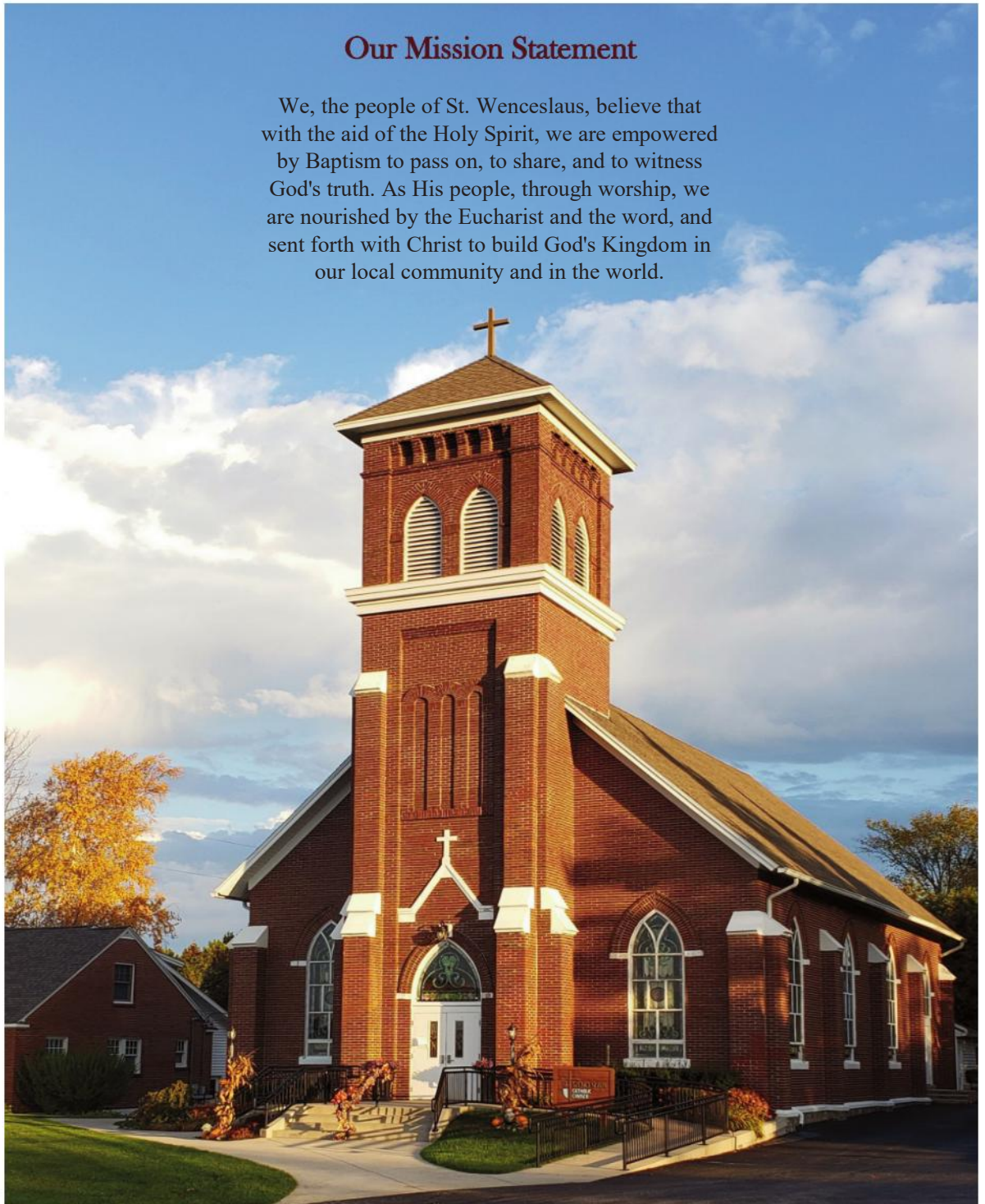

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. In this week-end's Gospel, Mark, 13: 24-32, Jesus talks of the end times when the Son of Man will come. There will be cosmic signs of things that will happen before His coming. Heaven and earth may pass away, but His words will never pass away. No one knows the day or hour, neither angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. But the coming of the Son of Man will indeed happen.

Throughout Scripture, we hear these words: be awake, be alert, be aware of the moment for we do not know what tomorrow will bring. We have only too look at life around us to know this is true. A pandemic comes without warning; a flash flood sweeps a car away; a building collapses in the middle of the night. We are reminded to live in the moment, be where you are, give your attention where you are. Being present in the moment opens us to the voice of God. When we fill our lives with things, personal plans for the day, joys of the day, our ambitions, we can shut out the voice of Jesus and not see or hear His presents. He does come in this generation. He speaks to us through Scripture, through friends, through the liturgy. He is found in the beggar, in our neighbor, in each other. Jesus wants to make Himself known to us. The Son of Man is indeed coming, be alert, look for Him, He is here.
