



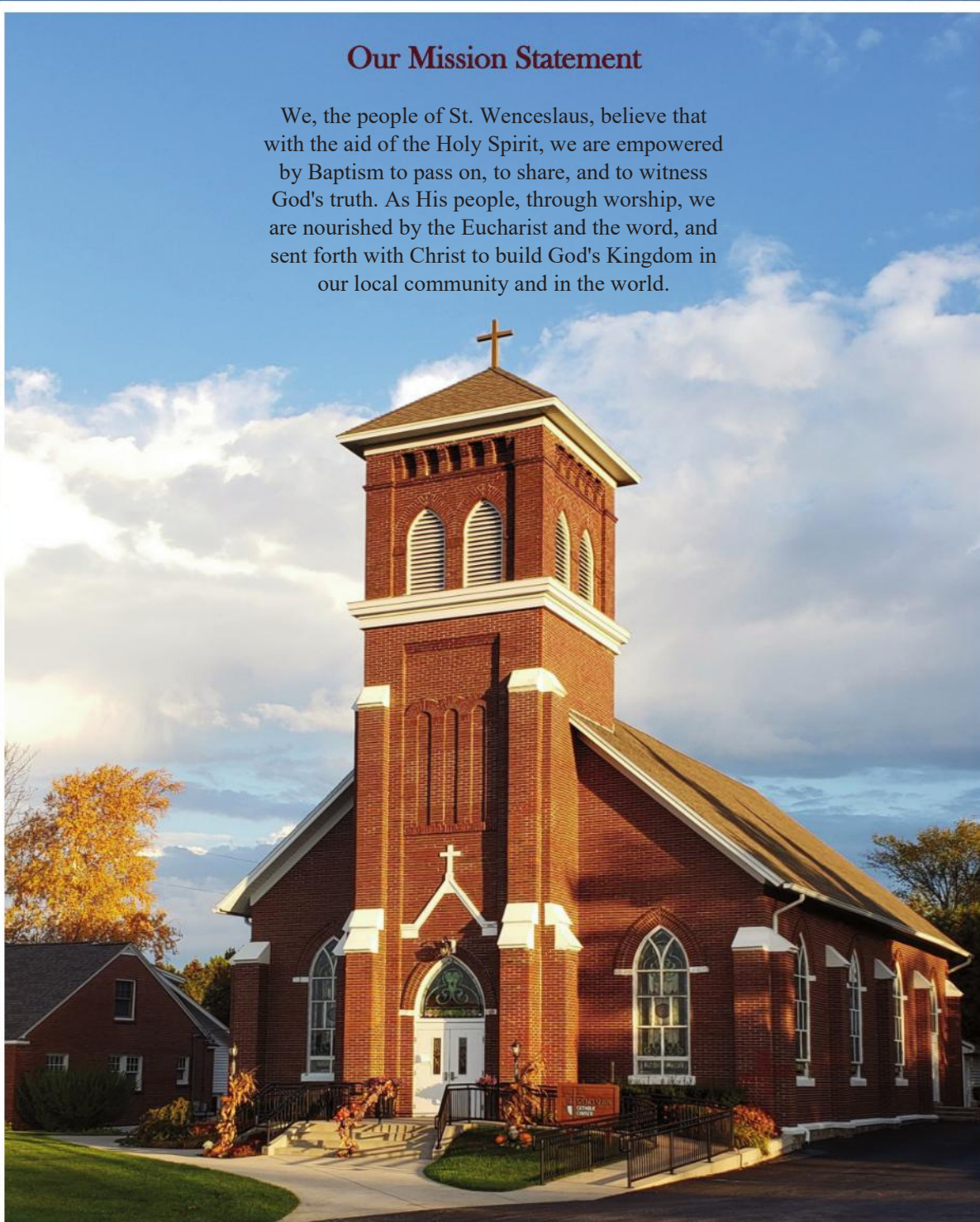

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. In this weekend's Gospel, John 18:33b-37, Pilate asks Jesus if He is the King of the Jews? Jesus responds, "My Kingdom is not of this world. You say I am a King. For this was I born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to My voice."

Jesus did not come to rule over peoples and territories, but to set people free from the slavery of sin and to reconcile them to God. Jesus affirms that he is a King, but not of this world. He came to free the world that had been enslaved to selfishness and separated from God. He came to show us how to live in harmony with God, the universe, and especially our neighbor. We are to live a humble life as servants to others, respect our environment, and have a personal relationship with God.

His Kingdom is not of this world and of its ways. It is about caring for each other. It is about how can I help? As someone has stated, "Ask not what your country can do for you, but what you can do for your country." We should do the same. Ask not what God's Kingdom can do for me, but what I can do for the Kingdom." The rewards will be great as we experience Jesus' abundant love, peace of mind, and mercy in this life and in the next when we will see face to face and live in His joyful embrace forever. Who do we serve, and who do we follow? Which kingdom do you want to spend eternity in, one of divisiveness or harmony? We are free to choose.
