Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent. Luke tells us in 3:10-18 what they should do. Three types of people ask. The common people, the tax collectors, and the soldiers. All were considered as outsiders, on the margin. Note, the religious leaders did not ask, nor did the educated. John the Baptist told them to share what they had, if you have two cloaks, share with the person who has none. Collect only the tax that is due. To the soldier he said, "Do not practice extortion, do not falsely accuse anyone, and be satisfied with your wages.

John told them to share what they had. This is the same message of Jesus. We are to share what we have, for what we have is a gift from God. It is only on loan from God to be given away. We can all downsize a little.

Do not charge more than what is necessary. These are very challenging times. Every day the price of something seems to go up. Remember it goes up for everyone. Others feel the same financial crunch. We have to look at it through the eyes of John the Baptist and Jesus Christ and not the world. What would you pay John and Jesus for their service or product. Jesus is in everyone we meet. Remember to treat them as such.

To those in authority, John told them not to abuse it. Those in charge are not to lord it over those who are under them. Everyone is our neighbor and our equal in the eyes of God. Keep order, without harsh words or brutal force. The advice John gave to the people is for us as well. Share what we have, be fair in treating people, and do not abuse our authority. It is the same message of Jesus Christ.

Let's put John's words into practice and use the sacrament instituted by Jesus. 
If you do not feel well, please consider not attending Mass. You can watch the Mass on the internet or the Mass in Gaylord is on TV at 8:00 a.m.
