Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the Gospel of John 2:1-11, we hear of Jesus, His mother, and His disciples attending a wedding feast at Cana in Galilee. At the wedding feast, they run out of wine. Jesus' mother comes to Him and tells Him the problem. Jesus tells His mother that it is of no concern of His. His mother, Mary, tells the servants to do what ever Jesus tells them. Jesus tells the servants to fill six stone water jars, each about twenty to thirty gallons, with water. He then instructs them to draw some out and take it to the head waiter. The head waiter not knowing what had happened, takes the sample to the bridegroom telling them that this is the best wine of the night. Jesus did this as the beginning of His signs and so to reveal His glory, and His disciples began to believe in Him.

Jesus would go on to perform many other signs in His ministry, but this is the first. He did so because His mother asked Him. Not just a little wine, but 120 to 180 gallons of choice wine. This was only for part of the wedding celebration, for they had already drank what the couple had provided. If there were 360 guests, that would mean each guest would have 2 additional bottles of wine available to them in addition to what they already had.

The message is that Jesus does no skimp on what He provides. He gives abundantly, over and above what we ask for. He will not be out done in generosity. We must ask for things in accord with His will. But we must ask.


The other message is that Mary, His mother, asked Jesus to help out. She did not tell him what to do. But instructed the servants to do what He tells them. Ask Mary's intercession and follow Jesus' instructions. Simple advice: Ask Mary, pray to Mary, she will talk to her son as she did at Cana. Then follow whatever Jesus asks of you. Trust in Jesus and Mary and life can be better here and for all eternity.

Area Happenings


Thursdays: Faith Enrichment resumes at St. Michael, SB Hall, 7 p.m.


