

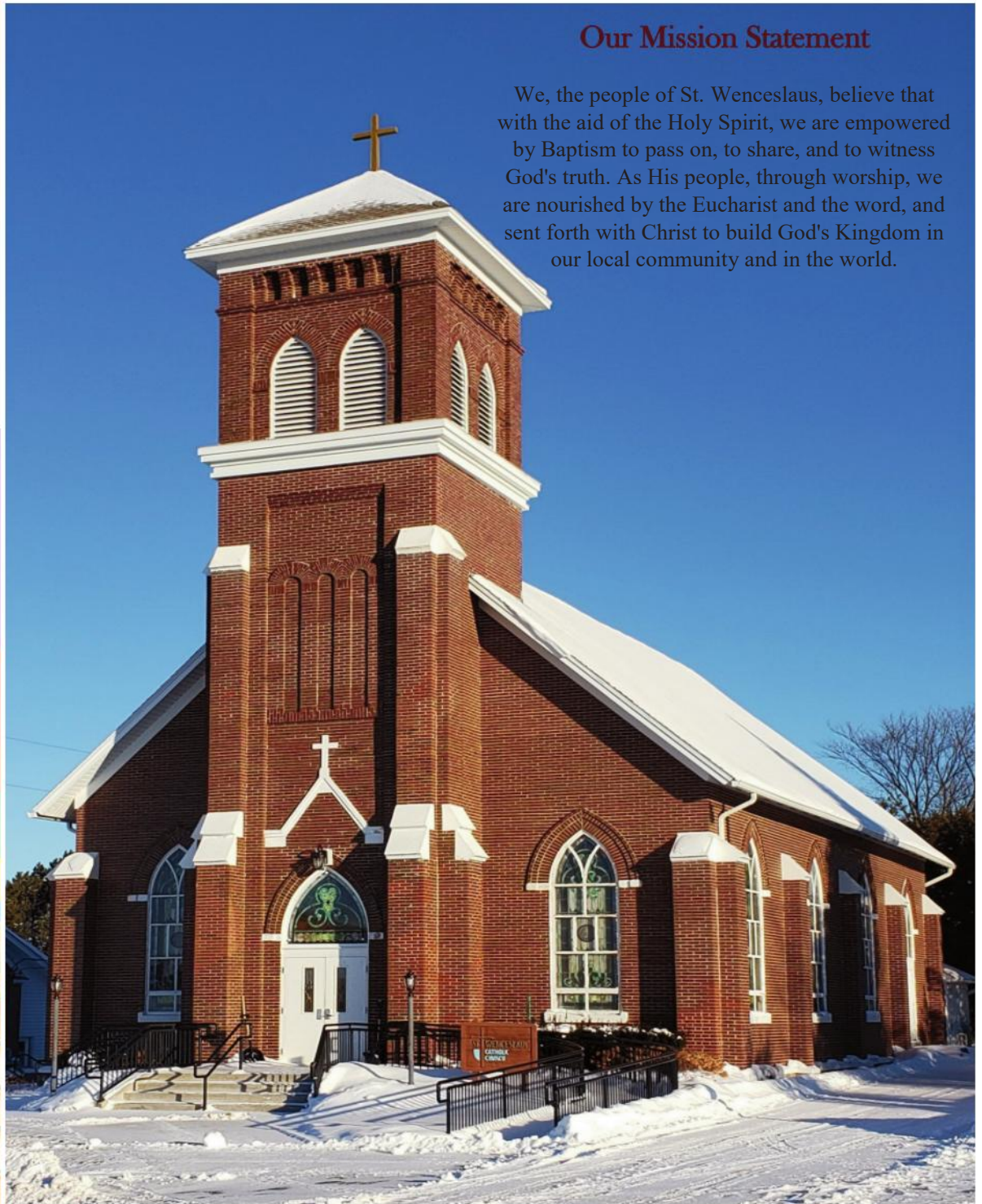

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Fourth Sunday in ordinary time. The Gospel of Luke 4:21-30, takes up where last week's Gospel left off. Jesus is in His home town and the town's people are impressed with the local boy. They ask Him to do what He did in Capernaum for them. Jesus tells them that Elijah was sent to a Zarephath widow in the time of famine to help. And Elisha healed a leper Naaman, a Syrian, neither of these were Jews. The townspeople wanted to hurl him off a cliff, but He passed through their midst and went away.

The Nazarenes were looking for some miracles. They did not specify what they were looking for. It is almost as if they wanted some kind of show, some magic. This was a local boy who did well. They wanted to be part of His success. They still considered Him one of them. They did not see Him as the Messiah or the Son Of God.

We, too, can be comfortable as Christians, as Catholics. Thinking we are saved because we know Jesus and we follow the commandments. We attend and support the church. We are good people. This is good. But Jesus asks us to be Holy, not just good. He asks us to know Him as the Son of God and to have a personal relationship with Him, not just know about Him. We do this by prayer, by communicating with Him, listening to Him, spending time with Him, trusting in Him. You can not go wrong having a relationship with Jesus. Now is the time to enhance that relationship. **Your Servant in Christ, Deacon Martin**
