Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Fifth Sunday in ordinary time. In the Gospel of Luke 5:1-11, we find Jesus standing by the Lake of Gennesaret with a crowd pressing and listening to him. He sees two boats and their owners washing their nets. He gets in Simon's boat and begins to teach the crowd. After He finished speaking, He said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon responds that they have been fishing all night and caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets.

They went out and caught fish until the nets were tearing. They called for help. They filled the other boat until both boats were in danger of sinking. Amazed at the catch, Simon asks Jesus to depart from him for he is a sinner, as did the others. Jesus responds to them, "Do not be afraid, from now on you will be catching men." They brought their boats to shore, left everything and followed Jesus.

We are like Simon and the others, we are sinners, not deserving to be in Jesus' presence. But Jesus still asks us to put out in to the deep, to share our faith, to catch men. He asks us to leave our comfort zone and go out into the world and share the message of Jesus. To leave behind those things that keep us from spending time with Him. To follow Him without reservation.

Jesus led the men on a new journey that they would never forget, or regret. They did not know what awaited them, nor do we. They knew Jesus from before, they had heard Him speak before, and trusted in Him. He tells them, as He tells us, do not be afraid. Jesus is calling us, we too know Him. He calls us in scripture, in prayer, through our neighbor, our surroundings, and each other. He leads us through the church, the sacraments, prayer, through each other. Jesus is calling us, is calling me. How will I respond? How will you respond? Be not afraid.

<u>Mondays</u>: Community Prayer Group meets 6:30—7:30 p.m. at St. Mary Church, LL, please bring a rosary.


Thursdays: Faith Enrichment at St. Michael SB Fr. Baker Hall at 7 p.m.
