

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the First Sunday in Lent. In the Gospel of Luke 4:1-13, Jesus is lead to the desert by the Holy Spirit. After eating nothing for forty days, He was hungry. The devil tempted Him three times. Once to turn stones into bread. Once to gain power and glory. And once to throw Himself off the parapet of the temple, tempting the Lord to save Him. If He is God, just do it. Jesus does not give into the devil's temptations. The devil leaves Jesus for a while.

Jesus is tempted to turn stones into bread, to feed himself, to take care of His hunger first, to look out for His comfort, to do His will and not His Father's will. Eating food is good, but it does not fill the heart. Power and glory are good, but they won't fill our hearts. Bargaining with the Lord may be tempting, but we are no where His equal.

We humans satisfy our hungers in many ways. There is a longing to be fulfilled. We seek fulfillment with food, drink, drugs, power, fame, and material things. We search for God in many places. The devil is very clever. He makes all these things seem very good. And they are. But we must always put God first. God's will first. Then our hearts will be filled. For our hearts were made for God. As St. Augustine said; "Our hearts are restless until they rest in You."
