

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Fourth Sunday in Lent. It is often referred to as Laetare Sunday. We are half way through Lent. In the Gospel of Luke 15:1-3, 11-32, Jesus tells the parable of the Prodigal son. One of two sons asks his father for his inheritance. The father gives it to him and he goes off to a distant country where he squanders it all. Having nothing left, he takes a job feeding pigs, the lowest job there is for a Jew. Realizing that even his father's lowest servant are treated better than this, he humbles himself and decides to go back home and ask for a simple job. The father seeing him coming rushes to him, embraces him and throws a big party out of joy for his return. The older son comes in from the field and resents the father for having received the younger son back. He would not join in the celebration, even though the father begs him to do so.

Which of the three main characters are we? Do we squander the talents and gifts God has given us? Do we go off and use our time only for ourselves? What distant land do we go to find satisfaction? How long will it take for us to realize the blessings we have and show our gratitude to God our Father and His loving mercy?

Are we the arrogant older son? We were faithful. We stayed the course. We were obedient and worked hard. We served wherever we could. We earned our position. We should be celebrated, honored, given recognition, rewarded for what we did, for staying faithful. Are we resentful of the late conversion? Do we judge like the Pharisees?

The real hero is the father. He loves both sons, regardless of what they did. He is merciful and forgiving. He seeks out both sons. He loves them both where they are. Which of the three characters in the parable are we?
