

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Fifth Sunday in Lent. In the Gospel of John, 8:1-11, some scribes and Pharisees bring a woman caught in adultery and make her stand in the middle of the temple area in front of Jesus along with all the other people. In Jewish law, she could be stoned to death for this behavior. They asked Jesus; what does He say? This was to test Him.

Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with His finger. When they continued to ask Him. He straightened up and said to them, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Again He bent down and wrote on the ground. One by one they went away, beginning with the elders, leaving Jesus alone with the woman. The temple area was empty. Jesus straightened up again and asks, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She replied, "No one Sir." "Then neither do I, go and sin no more."

This took place in a crowded area. Many people were following Jesus. The woman was surrounded by people, probably only men. No one offered her anything to shield her from the onlookers. No one questioned her accusers. No one came to her defense. She and Jesus stood alone in the temple area against all the others. If we were there, where would we be in the scene? Would we be in the crowd mocking her? Would we be turning to our neighbor saying she is guilty? Would we be looking for a stone? Would we be a defender or an accuser?

How do we treat those who do not measure up to our standard? Do we have a superior than thou attitude? Are we quick to point out an other's faults or mistakes? Do we share gossip? Are we sarcastic or rude? Where are we when there is no one else to help? Do we show mercy?

Jesus forgave all. He forgave the woman, He forgave the Pharisees and the scribes, He forgave the crowd. He forgives us even when we don't forgive ourselves. He stands with us when all the world seems to be against us. Jesus does not condemn the woman nor does he condemn the accusers. He is a forgiving God. He will forgive us all if we admit our faults.
