Dear fellow Parishioners,

Today is the Third Sunday of Easter. In today's Gospel, John 21:1-19, Jesus reveals Himself again to His disciples after His resurrection. The disciples at this time did not know what Jesus' plan was for them. Peter in his confusion decided to go fishing, his occupation. Some of the other disciples agreed to go with him. They fished all night and caught nothing. Coming toward shore they see a person on the beach with a fire. He asks if they caught anything. They answer no. The person tells them to cast the net over the right side. They do so and caught 153 large fish. Peter drags the net to shore. They recognize who it is but don't say anything. Jesus invites them to breakfast.

After breakfast, Jesus ask Peter if he loves Him three times. Peter responds that He does and that Jesus knows he loves Him. Jesus then tells Peter to tend to His sheep, to feed His sheep. Jesus is telling Peter and His disciples that as His followers they would have to do something. Going fishing is not what they would be doing for the rest of their lives. They would be doing His work. They would learn later how this would be accomplished.

We now know what Jesus meant when He told them to feed His sheep. He was asking them, and us, to share the message of Jesus' resurrection. To lead people spiritually. Lead them to Christ. To be a shepherd. To go before them. To walk with them and care for them. The disciples were able to do this because they were gifted with the Holy Spirit. We to were gifted with the Holy Spirit at baptism and confirmation. We too must do something. It is our task to feed each other, by prayer, by words of encouragement, and example. Let us all journey together in caring for each other.
