

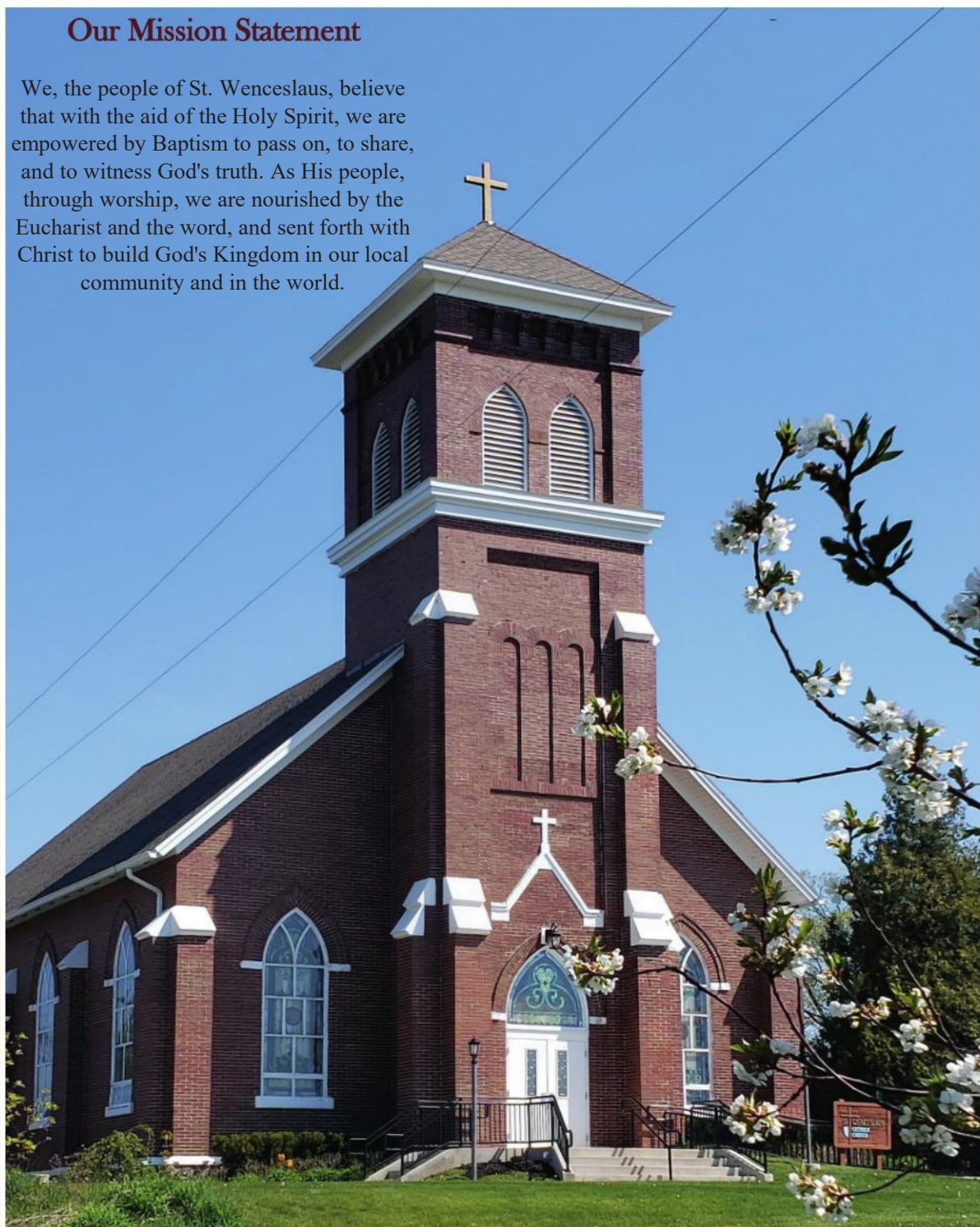

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord. In today's Readings, we read of Jesus' last instructions to His disciples. They will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon them, and they will be His witness in Jerusalem, and throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. The disciples watched as Jesus ascended into a cloud. As they were watching, there appeared two men dressed in white garments standing by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing here looking at the sky? Jesus will return in the same way you have seen Him going onto heaven."

The message for us is the same. We are to share the message of Christ, love God and our neighbor. His credentials are His life, His miracles, His death, resurrection, and His ascension. We are to share it with all throughout the world, not to stand around, but to get to work. We are all called to build the Kingdom of God.

This glorious feast of the Ascension — one of the "glorious mysteries" we pray on the rosary — asks each of us to do something glorious. It asks us to rise with Christ, to change the world. It asks us to defy the world. To change the world. Over the last few weeks, the one recurring theme in the Sunday readings is love. *Love one another.* We have heard it again and again in the readings. And for good reason. This is where we begin. Making that choice. Living that choice. And making that choice visible to a doubting and disbelieving world — a world that is increasingly turning away from Christ. Our mission is to change that. Live in a manner worthy of the calling by Christ. Be humble, gentle, patient, and love one another. Our actions speak louder than words. Now is the time. Don't just stand there looking up. Live the message.
