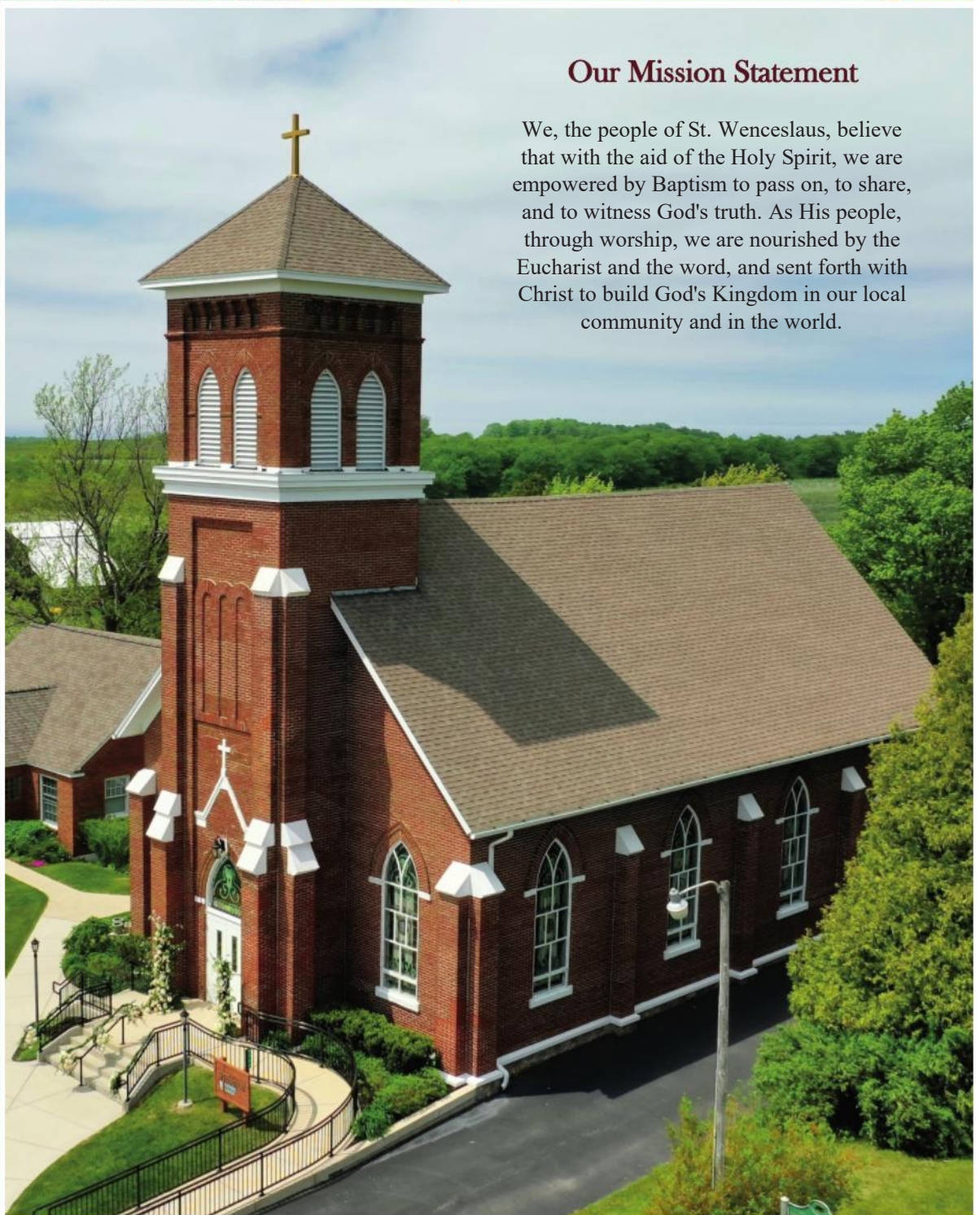

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate The Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel, Luke 10:1-12, 17-20, Jesus sends out seventy-two disciples in pairs to every town and village He intended to visit. He is sending like lambs among wolves. It will not be easy. They are to carry no money bag, no sandals, or no sack. They were to be completely depended on the Spirit. Talk to no one on the way. Do not be distracted by what is happening in the world. Stay only where you are welcome. Eat what is set before you, cure the sick and say to them, "The Kingdom of God is at hand for you." If they do not accept you, leave them, yet let them know: the Kingdom of God is at hand.

God is sending all of us on that same mission. Often times we want to rely on our own knowledge, our own abilities. Sometimes these can get in our way by blocking other options. We must open our minds to the options the Holy Spirit has for us. We are to depend on the Spirit for what we are to say, do, and eat. It is not for us to deny anyone the message. We are to share what we know about the Kingdom, and leave it up to them to accept or reject it. We all can share our story of how God has worked in our lives. No one can argue with what God has done for you. We are the messengers, not the Messiah. As disciples, we are to go out to others.
