Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate The Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel, Luke 12:32-48, Luke stresses the need to be ready for the return of Jesus, the Son of Man. The Son of Man is a figure prophesied by Daniel. To Him has been given all authority and kingship.

In the Gospels, Jesus often identifies Himself as the Son of Man who will come on the clouds of heaven. In today's passage, He is telling us that we need to be ready for the time when He will come to judge the living and the dead, and that no one knows when that time will come.

It will be sudden, just like the suddenness of a thief into someone's home in the middle of the night. Jesus is saying to us that we should not relax in our zeal to follow Him, always observing His commandments. Rather we should persevere in doing what we know to be good.

In all circumstance, we are called to love our neighbor, especially our enemies. To remain faithful in prayer, especially when it is difficult. To remain attentive to the movements of the Holy Spirit, especially when he challenges us, and not give up on God when life gets difficult and all hope seems to vanish.

We do not know when we will die, or when Jesus will return. However, if we remain faithful, we will be ready to meet Jesus when He comes. Always be ready. Just prepare for that day, everyday. It is called prayer.


