Dear fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate The Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel, Luke 18:9-14, Jesus tells His disciples a parable about two people who went to the temple area to pray. A Pharisee took his position and prayed to himself, thanking God that he was not like the rest of humanity. Greedy dishonest, adulterous, or even like this tax collector. He bragged about fasting twice a week, and tithed on his whole income. The tax collector stood off at a distance beating his breast not even lifting his eyes to heaven praying, 'O God be merciful to me a sinner." I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former, for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted.

When we pray, which one of the two men are we. They both went to the temple to pray. But their prayer was very different. The Pharisee told God how good he was. He was proud of his accomplishment. He had done this by himself; he did not need God. He was doing quite well without Him.

The tax collector admits his failings to God, realizing his need for forgiveness and mercy from God. He knows he needs God's help to lead a better life. He comes with a humble heart, admitting his dependence on God. He wants a better relationship with

How do we pray? Are we like the Pharisee and boast of our successes, or do we pray like the tax collector? Do we thank God for helping us in our success, and give Him credit for it? Do we admit our failings and ask for forgiveness and mercy? Pray, and ask God for His mercy and help in building a better relationship with Him.


