Today we celebrate The Epiphany of the Lord. In today's Gospel, Matthew 2:1 -12, we are told the narrative of the coming of the three wise men following a star. King Herod was ruler and was troubled about these men searching for the newborn King. Herod has a meeting with the wise men and asks them to search and find the child and report back to him. They find him and give Him homage. Warned in a dream, they returned a different way on their journey.

As the shepherds search for the child, so did the wise men from the east. They traveled many miles to find the newborn King. Upon finding Him, their lives were changed. They realized their journey home had to be different, there was no going back to the life they had.

So it is with us. If we seek the Christ, our life will change. Our journey through life will be different. We will have to give up the old ways that block our way in our search.
