

Dear fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel, Matthew 4:12-23, John the Baptist is arrested. Jesus moves to Capernaum. From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the Kingdom of heaven is at hand." He was walking by the Sea of Galilee when He saw men attending their nets; Simon, Andrew, James, and John. He asked them to join Him, and they immediately followed Him. Jesus did not start His mission alone.

These men were disciples of John the Baptist. They had known Jesus before. They were at the wedding in Cana, where Jesus changed the water into wine. They were not strangers to Jesus. They knew He was someone special. So when they were invited by Jesus, they felt honored to do so. They knew not what they were being asked to do.

Jesus went to these men where they were. He met them in their everyday life, a midst the humdrum of the good and the bad. He walks into their environment, he walks into our environment. He meets us where we are. His invitation is for all of us to follow Him, to be part of His mission, the building the Kingdom of God. Jesus does not work alone. He needs our help. Will we leave our old life behind and follow Jesus?

Sunday, January 22 is Human Life Sunday, a day for Americans to focus on the value of each and every human life. It is celebrated every year close to the Supreme Court's decision Roe vs Wade & Doe vs Bolton. The decisions were overturned in Dobbs vs Jackson Women's Health Organization on June 24, 2022.
