

### Dear fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate The First Sunday of Lent. In today's Gospel, Matthew 4:1-11, Jesus, after fasting for forty days in the desert, was tempted by the devil. He was tempted to turn stones into loaves of bread, to jump off a high building, and have all the kingdoms of the world and all their magnificence, if only He would bow down and worship him.

The devil was tempting both Jesus' humanity and His divinity. He was tempted to feed Himself, to use His power for Himself, to place Himself first before all creation, to possess creation for His own benefit. Jesus could have had it all, if only He would submit Himself to the ways of the devil.

We too are tempted by the devil in much the same way. We are tempted to take care of ourselves first. To be sure my needs are met before anyone else's. To keep a little extra for myself. To use my talents to get ahead, and not to help some one else. As the old saying goes; "We are tempted with commercials to buy stuff we don't need, to impress people we don't know, with money we don't have."

The devil is very cleaver. He appeals to our human nature. To our desire for instant gratification. He knows we cannot resist him on our own. So he tempts us with things we can see, hoping we will not pay attention to the God behind creation. He tries to hide God from us. For without God we will give into temptation.

We can overcome temptation only with God's help. We need the Holy Spirit, God the Father and Jesus Christ's assistance to overcome the devil. They are by our side if we want their help. We have only to recognize them, acknowledge them, and accept their help. Pray.

**Practices for Lent:** Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fast and Abstinence. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence, meaning that no meat is allowed. A fast day means that one full meal and two lesser meals are allowed. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have reached the age of fourteen. Fasting is for those who have reached the age of eighteen until the beginning of the sixtieth year.
