

Dear fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate The Second Sunday of Lent. In today's Gospel, Matthew 17:1-9, Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a high mountain by themselves, and He was transformed before them. While this was taking place, a voice from a cloud was heard: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him."

These are words spoken to the three apostles as well as to us. God the Father is telling us who Jesus is. There should be no doubt in our minds who Jesus is. He is the Son of God, told to us by God the Father. If we cannot believe the Father, Who can we believe? What can we believe?

The voice also tells us "to listen to Him", to Jesus. If we are to listen to Jesus, we need to know Jesus, we need to study His life, His actions, His miracles, and to pray. We have a responsibility to follow God the Father's advice. For Jesus is our guide to fulfillment, and to the meaning of happiness which we all long for. Jesus Christ alone is the answer, the secret to a life lived to the fullest.

The Father's invitation to listen to Jesus needs a response from us. We do this by actively pursuing a close relationship with Christ. We can do little or nothing, which is also a response to the Father's request. Either way, we are responding to the Fathers request. **Listen to Jesus, follow His example**.


Area Happenings
