

Dear fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate The Third Sunday of Lent. In today's Gospel, John 4:5-4, Jesus talks to a Samaritan woman at the well. He asks her for a drink of water. This seems like a very innocent request. But this request violated many customs of the Jewish people. She was a woman, a stranger, a Samaritan, someone the Jews did not get along with, Jesus asked her for help, He asked to drink out of her cup, to share with her. She was not in favor with the other woman, for she came at a time when the others were not there. Jesus was really opening Himself up to this woman in conversation. He shared with her His faith; He explained that they would eventually worship together, for salvation will come from the Jews. He told her He was the Messiah. Jesus gives us an example of how to meet the stranger, to be open to conversation even if we have disagreements, to discuss differences without condemning, to be open to others ideas, to share a table or cup with someone we are not close to, and to share our faith. How welcoming are we? How well do we greet the stranger? We encounter many people in our journey through life. How we respond to them is a choice we make. Entering into conversation is the first step of affirming their presence, acknowledging their existence. Listening gives them value. Eye contact helps make a connection. Jesus does it all with the woman at the well. How do we respond to the woman at the well, at the mall, at church? Do we share our faith? Lets imitate Jesus in meeting people. **Your Servant in Christ, Deacon Martin**


