


Dear fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate The Fifth Sunday of Lent. In today's Gospel, John 11:1-45, Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead. Lazarus, Martha, and Mary were good friends of Jesus. When Lazarus got sick, they sent for Jesus. When Jesus hears of Lazarus' illness He waits three days before He journeys to see them. He states to His disciples that "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it."

Jesus was a close friend of Lazarus, Mary, and Martha. They are aware of the many miscalls and healings He had done. They expected Jesus to answer their request, their prayer, and come sooner. They were very disappointed in Jesus when their brother Lazarus died. They criticized Jesus for not coming sooner, but believed even now that Jesus could do something.

We have many challenges in our life. We pray to God for many things. We tell God what He should do, how to alleviate our problem. We see through our small human eyes, while God sees the whole picture. He knows what is best for us. Some day we will know why things happen the way they do. We must trust in God and His best judgment for us in all situations. Keep praying and accepting God's will. He knows best.
