Dear fellow Parishioners,

Today is Easter Sunday. In Christian Churches all over the world people are celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, through scripture and Homilies. Mary of Magdala was the first to go to the tomb and found the stone removed from the tomb. She ran to Peter and the other disciples and told them; "They have taken the Lord from the tomb and we don't know where they put Him." Peter and an other disciple ran to the tomb. Peter bent down and entered. He found the cloth that had covered His head, not with the burial cloths, but rolled up in a separate place. The other disciple entered as well; he saw and believed.

Mary Magdala was a friend of Jesus. He had healed her of seven demons. A close friend of Jesus, she was at the foot of the cross and saw Jesus die. She was there when they took Him down from the cross and saw Jesus be buried. So when she saw the tomb empty, she had to be surprised.

The huge stone, the armed guards, the early morning, the darkness, were all obstacles to Mary and added to her uncertainty. But she went anyway to seek Christ. Her love for Him drew her to this place where she last saw Him. She did not know the full scope of what had happened, she would later learn of His resurrection.

We know now how the story ends, that Jesus rose from the dead and is alive. His resurrection validates all He said and did. He is the son of God. He is our savior. He has conquered death for us all. Do we love, believe and seek Christ out amidst the obstacles of life? How has the empty tomb affected us? Rejoice and be glad. Happy Easter.



Abuse of Minors or Vulnerable Adults by Priests, Deacons or Others

To report allegations of sexual abuse of minors or vulnerable adults within the Diocese of Gaylord by priests, deacons or other employees or volunteers, regardless of when it occurred, individuals should: Contact local law enforcement and the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (855-444-3911). The Michigan Attorney General's Office has also set up a special phone line for people to share information that may be of help in their ongoing investigation of sexual misconduct by Catholic clergy. That number is 844-324-3374. You may also contact the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator, Larry LaCross, at 989-705-9010. In the State of Michigan many professionals, including clergy, teachers, doctors, counselors and named others are mandated reporters. This means such individuals are REQUIRED to make an oral or online report IMMEDI-ATELY to the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services if they suspect a child is being neglected or abused in any way.


