Dear fellow Parishioners,

Today is the Second Sunday of Easter, or Divine Mercy Sunday. In today's Gospel, John 20:19-31, Jesus appears to the disciples. He says to them, "Peace be with You." When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. He again says to them, "Peace be with you, as the Father has sent Me, so I send You." He then breathes on them saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sin you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain, they are retained."

The Gospel continues with Thomas not being there, and so he does not believe. Later, when Thomas is there, Jesus again appears, saying "Peace be with You." Thomas believes because he sees. Jesus speaks directly to us, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Jesus is calling us blessed because we believe even though we have not seen His wounds. We believe in His resurrection, in His glorified body, His forgiveness, His conquering death, and life eternal with Him. He wished them Peace even though they ran from Him in the garden. They all abandoned Him, though some came back. He forgave and wished them "Peace"; He showed them mercy.

Jesus demonstrated His forgiveness of the disciples, and asked them to forgive others in His name. He breathed on them and established the sacrament of confession. This is something He felt was necessary. This is a sacrament showing His Divine Mercy. This is a sacrament He wants us to use. This is Divine Mercy Sunday, a day to remind us of Jesus' mercy. Please make use of this sacrament and go to confession.


