Dear fellow Parishioners,

Today is the Third Sunday of Easter. In today's Gospel, Luke 24:13-35, we find two of Jesus's disciples walking away from Jerusalem. They are sadden and disappointed at the death of Jesus Christ, their friend whom they thought to be the Messiah, their savior from Rome. They were walking back to Emmaus to their old way of life.

A stranger catches up with them and they began to discuss all the things that happen this past week. The stranger begins to tell them what the prophets spoke about. The stranger broke open the scripture to them and explained how the Christ would suffer these things and enter into His glory.

As they approached the village, the disciples asked the stranger to stay with them. And so it happened, that while He was at table, He took bread, said the blessing, broke it and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized Him, But he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while He spoke to us on the way and opened the scripture to us?"

They then returned to Jerusalem, recounting all that had happened on the way to the apostles and others gathered there, how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

We are like the two disciples, sometimes saddened and disappointed as to how life is going. We are tempted to go back to our old ways, seeking comfort from the world. Like the disciples, we need to turn to scripture to lead us back to Christ. Let scripture speak to our heart. These are not simply nice stories, but messages from God to us, today. Jesus wants to break open the scripture to us.

But scripture is not enough. We must also experience the breaking of the bread, the Eucharist. It is the two together, the scripture and the breaking of the bread that make up the Mass. It is being attentive to the Mass that we too can experience the presence of Jesus in our life as did the two disciples.




