Dear fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday. In today's Gospel, John 20:19-23, Jesus appears to His disciples in a locked room. The disciples were afraid of the Jews and were in hiding. Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent Me, so I send you." Jesus then breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Several things happened that day. Jesus gave the disciples, us, actual facts that He was alive. They could visually see Him. They could touch Him. He was living proof of His resurrection.

He wished them peace; He wishes us peace. A peace that is a peace of heart. Jesus' peace is peace with God, peace with self, and peace with neighbor. We have less stress, less anxiety, and less worry. We trust more in God and less in ourselves. It is a free gift if we accept it.

Jesus gave them a mission, gave us a mission. That mission is to preach the Gospel by word and by deed. It is not only for clergy or for saints and mystics. It is for us; it is for everyone.

He breathed on them and they received the Holy Spirit. He gave the disciples and their successors the power to forgive sins in the name of Jesus Christ. This is the sacrament of reconciliation. Nothing is more powerful than the forgiveness of God. We can start a new, a fresh new life, with peace in our heart.

Pentecost changed the world for ever. It gave us living proof of Jesus' resurrection. It gave us the Holy Spirit. It gave us the sacrament of confession and it gave us a mission. Do we appreciate all that happened that day? Are we doing our part?


