Dear fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate The Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel, Matthew 10:37-42, Jesus tells His disciples that they are to love Him more than anyone else. This includes, mother, father, spouse, or children. If we do not, we are not worthy of Him. We are to take up our cross and follow Him. Who ever finds his life will lose it and who ever loses his life for His sake, will find it.

Jesus is telling us that God must be number one. It is He who we were destined to be with, now and for all eternity. We are to love our parents, our spouse, our children, our siblings, and our neighbor. This is His second commandment. The second greatest thing in the world is not the first. The first is our heavenly Father.

We must take up our cross daily and follow Jesus. There's a cross for every one, there's a cross for you and me. Our cross will turn into a crown, and our wounds into beauty marks, just as it did for Jesus.

We carry our Christ's cross by carrying other people's crosses. That's the point the next saying of Jesus that Matthew quotes: "Whoever receives you, receives me, and whoever receives me, receives the one who sent Me." He also said: "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." Even the cup of cold water that we give to our thirsty child, or the smile we give when we greet someone, is received and enjoyed not just by that person, but also by Christ.

We are to love God first, and our neighbor as Christ loved us. It is in loving our neighbor who we see, that we love God whom we do not see. Our relationship with God is based on love and prayer. Pray often to God if you want to spend eternity with Him.


The Parish Office will be closed all next week. We will be open for regular office hours again on Wednesday, July 12, 2023.




