

### Dear fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate The Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel, Matthew 13:24-43, Jesus tells the parable about the sower going out to sow good seed. But in the night an enemy came and sowed weeds throughout the wheat field. When the slaves saw this they asked the master if they should remove the weeds. The master told them to let them both grow, but at harvest time to separate them. Burn the weeds and bring the wheat into my barns.

We live in a world in which Jesus came and spread the good seed, the word of God. The enemy, the devil, came and spread the weeds, fake news, false information, lies, deception, just like he did with Adam and Eve. He told them that they could become like God, they could be in control, that God had lied to them when He told them not to eat of the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden.

There are many weeds in the world today. People passing out opinions on just about everything. Redefining words to meet their agenda. Attempting to soften the teaching of Christ. Ignoring the Ten Commandments given to us by God. Thinking man has a better idea on how the world should be run, that man can and will solve all problems.

These are very challenging times for us today. Information comes at us from the news media, from social media, from the newspaper, the TV, from the movies, even the local ice cream store. They have *Super Person* ice cream. Not *Super Man* ice cream. Sometimes it is very innocent. We may think it does not matter. But it is still sending a message.




