Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Transfiguration of the Lord. In today's Gospel, Matthew 17:1-9, Jesus takes Peter, James, and his brother up a high mountain where he is transformed before them. His face shone like the sun and His clothes became white as a light. Moses and Elijah appeared conversing with Him. A voice from the cloud said; "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased, listen to Him." The disciples became very much afraid and fell prostrate on the ground. Jesus touched them and told them not to be afraid. Coming down the mountain Jesus told them not to share anything until the Son of man has been raised from the dead.

Jesus took three apostles up a high mountain. In those days, the higher up you got it was though you were closer to God. He took three, reminding us that where two or more are gathered in his name, He is there with us. In this incident the disciples saw a glimpse of what the future held for them, for our selves. Later they would come to understand the importance of Elijah, the prophet. Moses the Law giver, and Jesus the fulfillment of all that was predicted.

The transfiguration of Jesus is a very important time in the life of the disciples, and in our lives. It is a time to recognize that all that was predicted about the Messiah was about to happen. That Jesus is the Son of God. That we are to listen to Him. Not just to listen, but to follow and imitate Him. To pray and be holy. Pray with others, or go off to a quiet place and pray alone. Be aware of your surroundings. Listen for the voice of God. He is there. Take the time, make an effort.

Walk with Jesus to a special place. You may be surprised at the change, transformation, that will take place in your life. Jesus has invited us to that special place to be with Him. To give us a glimpse of our future. Let Jesus touch you, and be not afraid.


