Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel, Matthew 25:1-13, Jesus tells His disciples a parable about 10 virgins who were a waiting the bridegroom. Five were wise and brought extra oil for their lamps. Five did not bring extra oil. They were not prepared and had to leave their post and get oil from the merchants. While they were gone, the bridegroom came, all went in and the door was closed and locked. When the other virgins came, they were not allowed in. The door keeper said: I do not know you.

The door is death. Death locks the door to anymore chances. If we are not prepared for other things in life, we might get a second chance. But no one gets a second chance after death. As you die, so you lie. If you die inside the wedding feast, you are inside it forever; if you die outside it, you are outside it forever.

It is like Noah's ark. Once the door was closed, no one else was admitted. Those inside were saved; those on the outside were took under in the water. They did not listen to the warning of the coming flood. Second chances do not go on forever. Life in time does not go on forever. At some point the door is closed. And where you die, there you lie; either in or out we are to be prepared at all times. One thing is sure, Jesus is coming again; for each of us. Will we be prepared to meet Him? Will He know us?


