Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent for the year 2023. In today's Gospel, Mark, 13:33-37, Jesus tells his disciples; "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come, when the Lord of the house will come." He tells this to us all: "Watch."

Jesus tells us all to be watchful. To watch for Him when He returns. He has come 2,000 years ago, at the first Christmas, as an infant in Bethlehem. He will come again at the end of time. At our death it will be the end of time as we know it. Time does come to an end. Only eternity last forever. We all need to be prepared to meet him at this moment in time, for none of us know this time. Not even those who are on hospice.

But Jesus comes to us in the present, He comes to us every day, He comes to us in many disguises. He comes to us in the Eucharist. He comes to us in scripture. He comes to us through the Church. He comes to us in all the people we meet. He comes to us in the many opportunities in our life to serve others. As He said in last weeks Gospel: "As long as you did it for the least of them, you did it for Me." We all need to learn how to see Jesus in each other, in the situations we find ourselves, in the challenges we encounter. They are all around us. Jesus is ever present to us.

We are all called to be watchful at all times. To be watchful in this present time. To slow down, to focus on the moment. To recognize Jesus is with us, is before us, now. All we have to do is "Watch" He is coming.

We will decorate the Church for Christmas on Sunday, December 17, after Mass. All are welcome to help.


